

COLLEGE GAMES AT WORCESTER.

Williams Team Wins—Brown Second, Bowdoin Third.

Worcester, Mass., May 20.—The New England Intercollegiate Athletic Association held its fourteenth annual meet here yesterday. Williams won the meet, scoring 30 2-3 points. Brown was second with 28 2-3 and Bowdoin third with 25. In spite of the bad condition of the track and field, due to the heavy rain, three records were broken. H. H. Cloudman of Bowdoin lowered the time for the 220-yards dash by doing the distance in 22 1-5 seconds, one-fifth of a second below the record made by H. C. Hyde of Dartmouth in 1892, and equaled by Curtenius of Amherst in 1898. A. L. Grover of the University of Maine, in the discus throw, bettered his record of last year by eight inches. H. H. Cloudman of Bowdoin broke the record for the broad jump with a leap of 22 feet 8 inches. The most prominent point winners were: H. H. Cloudman of Bowdoin, who took three firsts; Captain John Bray of Williams, two firsts; J. G. Melandy of Brown, two firsts.

The meet was a most remarkable one in many ways. Had it not been for the unfavorable weather it is certain that the Mott Haven records would have been very nearly equaled and in some cases surpassed. All of the records made were good considering the condition of the track and field, and the performance of Cloudman of Bowdoin in the 220-yards dash, after winning the 100 in 10 1-5, is little short of marvelous. 80-Yards Run—Won by D. C. Hall of Brown; F. H. Klaer of Amherst, second; H. L. Trull of Dartmouth, third; time, 2:04 $\frac{1}{2}$.

220-Yards Dash, Final—Won by H. H. Cloudman of Bowdoin; C. G. McDevitt of Dartmouth, second; A. C. Patterson of Williams, third; time, 22 $\frac{1}{5}$ seconds (new record).

120-Yards Hurdles, Final—Won by Paul Potter of Williams; P. P. Edson of Dartmouth, second; H. J. Hunt of Bowdoin, second; time, 16 $\frac{1}{2}$ seconds.

Two-Mile Run—Won by D. C. Hall of Brown; John Bray of Williams, second; E. C. Hawley of Amherst, third; time, 19:29.

120-Yard Hurdles, Final—Won by R. S. Edwards of Bowdoin; E. S. Little of Brown, second; Paul Potter of Williams, third; time, 24 $\frac{1}{4}$ seconds.

Mile Run—Won by John Bray of Williams; R. L. Frost of M. I. T., second; E. C. Hawley of Amherst, third; time, 4:42 $\frac{1}{2}$.

100-Yards Dash, Final—Won by H. H. Cloudman of Bowdoin; R. S. Edwards of Bowdoin, second; C. G. McDevitt of Dartmouth, third; time, 10 $\frac{1}{5}$ seconds.

440-Yards Dash, Final—Won by L. R. Hill of Dartmouth; C. F. Park of Williams, second; D. F. Snow of Bowdoin, third; time, 52 $\frac{1}{2}$ seconds.

Running High Jump—L. G. Blackmer of Williams, F. K. Baxter of Massachusetts Institute of Technology and R. M. Shayne of Williams tied for first at 5 feet, 3 inches; points divided.

Running Broad Jump—Won by H. H. Cloudman of Bowdoin, distance 22 feet, 8 inches; C. N. Brown of Brown, second, distance 22 feet, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches; Hubbard of Dartmouth, third.

Pole Vault—Won by F. Squires of Williams; A. T. Holton of Brown, second; T. S. Cline of Wesleyan, third; height, 18 feet.
