

# AMHERST FIRST IN NEW ENGLAND GAMES.

## Dartmouth Finished a Close Second at Worcester.

Amherst won the New England intercollegiate championship at Worcester Oval Saturday for the fourth successive year. Dartmouth made a hard fight for first place scoring 38½ points against 38½ for Amherst. The victory gives Amherst a strong lead for the ten-year championship. Brown finished third and Williams and Technology were tied for fourth place.

Three new records were established, two previous marks were equalled, while Denning of Bowdoin, after winning the hammer throw, made a new exhibition record.

W. P. Hubbard of Amherst placed the new broad jump record at 23 feet 2½ inches, beating the previous record of H. C. Van Welden of Trinity, made in 1902, by 8¼ inches. H. G. Leavitt of Williams ran the 220-yard hurdles in 25 1-5 seconds, the previous record being 25 4-5 seconds, made by P. P. Edson of Dartmouth, in 1901, while F. H. Ehnke of Brown beat his own discus record, made last year, by 7 inches, throwing the weight 119 feet 3 inches.

G. L. Swasey of Dartmouth equalled previous marks in the short sprints.

Points scored were as follows: Amherst 38½, Dartmouth 36½, Brown 17, Williams 13, M. I. T. 13, Bowdoin 12, Wesleyan 11, Maine 5½, Tufts 4½, Trinity 2½.

The high jump proved a peculiar contest, as four men tied for the first four places, the quartet falling when the bar was at five feet six inches. On the toss-up for prizes, Shaw of Maine, Zeltu of Tufts, Brown of Trinity and Bishop of Amherst finished in the order named. Summary.

120-yards hurdles—Final heat won by Leavitt of Williams, Hubbard of Amherst 2d, Tobey of Bowdoin 3d, Griswold of Williams 4th; time, 15 4-5s.

220-yards hurdles—Final heat won by Leavitt of Williams, J. H. Hubbard of Amherst 2d, W. P. Hubbard of Amherst 3d, Shaw of Dartmouth 4th; time, 25 1-5s.

### Field Events.

Running high jump—Finals, first place tied, with Shaw of Maine, Zeltu of Tufts, G. D. Brown, jr., of Trinity and Bishop of Amherst, all clearing the bar at 5 feet 4¾ inches, and falling at 5 feet 6 inches. In the toss-up for medals they were distributed in the order given.

Throwing 16-pound hammer—Finals, won by Denning of Bowdoin, 132 feet 7 inches; Knapp of M. I. T. 2d, 128 feet 7 inches; Gage of Dartmouth 3d, 121 feet 3 inches; Rollins of Amherst 4th, 121 feet ¼ inch.

Throwing discus—Finals, won by Ehnke of Brown, 119 feet 3 inches; Dearborn of Wesleyan 2d, 118 feet ½ inch; Blake of Dartmouth 3d, 108 feet 5½ inches; Rollins of Amherst 4th, 102 feet 4½ inches.

Putting 16-pound shot—Won by Rollins of Amherst, 42 feet 4¾ inches; Denning of Bowdoin 2d, 42 feet 1 inch; Marshall of Williams 3d, 40 feet 4¾ inches; Ehnke of Brown 4th, 38 feet 7 inches.

Running broad jump—Finals, won by W. P. Hubbard of Amherst, 23 feet 2¾ inches, a new record; Head of Amherst 2d, 22 feet ¼ inch; Gray of Dartmouth and Green of Tufts tied for 3d, 21 feet.

Pole vault—Finals, won by Hazen of Dartmouth, 16 feet 6 inches; Eyster of Wesleyan, Crook of Amherst and Farlington of M. I. T. tied for 2d, 16 feet.
