

DARTMOUTH LOOKS LIKE THE WINNER.

HER MEN QUALIFY IN TEN OF THE EVENTS.

FIVE FROM TRINITY TO BE IN THE FINALS.

Dearborn of Wesleyan Breaks Discus Record—Technology and Williams Make Good Showing—Amherst Shows Loss of Captain Hubbard.

Boston, Mass., May 18.—The breaking of the discus record by Dearborn of Wesleyan and the strength of the Dartmouth team were the features in the wending out event which today opened the annual two days' championship meet of the New England Intercollegiate Athletic Association, held this year on Technology Field in Brookline. Dearborn, besides leading the shot putters, hurled the discus 129 feet, 11½ inches, which was one foot eight and a half inches better than the record made last year at Worcester by Ehnke of Brown.

Dartmouth qualified men in ten of the eleven events which were on today's card and in the half-mile four of the eight runners will be wearers of the green. Dartmouth will also have three of the six men in the 120-yard hurdles and two each in the high hurdles, the 120-yard dash and the hammer throw.

The next best showing was made by the team for the Massachusetts Institute of Technology which qualified men in seven of the eleven events and in four of them will have two representatives tomorrow. The Williams team was also strong, while Amherst showed the loss of W. F. Hubbard, her captain, who is H. J. H. Hubbard of Amherst, qualified in two of the events of the afternoon and will probably be a factor in the finals tomorrow. Brown came through the preliminaries with six men and in the running, while Trinity had five, University of Maine, Tufts and Wesleyan four each, while Bowdoin had one man left in the quarter mile when the day closed.

The best heats of the day were the second in the high hurdles and the first in the half mile. In the former Griswold of Williams, pushed Shaw of Dartmouth so hard that the winner finished within 1/4 of a second of the record. In the first heat of the half mile, Ayres of Williams, Shipley and Carns of Dartmouth and Morris of Trinity all finished so close that a basket could have been thrown over the bunch. The time, however, was slow.

If Swazy is in good form tomorrow and the rest of the Dartmouth team shows up as well as it did today, it is thought that the championship will go to the New Hampshire College for the first time in ten years. The men were favored today with ideal weather, it being warm with scarcely any breeze.

44-Yard Dash—Howe and Blackburn of Technology, White of Amherst, Honess of Brown, Kimball of Bowdoin, Taylor of Trinity, Swartz of Tufts, Wyman of Maine, Jennings of Dartmouth. Best time 14 seconds, made by Swartz of Tufts.

120-Yard Run—Jennings, Thrall, Shipley and Carns of Dartmouth, Ayres of Williams, Morris of Trinity, Powers of Tufts. Best time 2:08, made by Ayres.

120-Yard Hurdles—Gray and Shaw of Dartmouth, J. H. Hubbard of Amherst, Griswold of Williams. Best time 14 4/4 seconds, made by both Shaw and Hubbard.

120 yard hurdles—Shaw, Brown and Kullberg of Dartmouth; J. H. Hubbard of Amherst; Pond of Trinity; Mayhew of Brown. Best time, 28 1/4 seconds, made by Shaw and Pond.
