In a sensational meet, in which two association records were broken and one equaled, Dartmouth again carried off the team and individual honors in the annual championship competition of the New England Intercollegiate A. A., held under the auspices of Massachusetts Institute of Technology on Tech field in Brookline yesterday afternoon.

Three Dartmouth men alone—Sherman, the sprinter; Shaw, the hurdler, and Peavear, the discus and hammer thrower—scored six firsts and two seconds for their team, or 36 out of the 49 points scored for the Green.

Sherman had it easy in both the 100 and 220-yard dashes, and was first in the broad jump, winning the highest individual honors of the meet and scoring 15 points.

Peavear made a new association record for the discus, 123ft 8¼in, and also was second in the shotput and hammer throw, scoring 11 points in all.

Shaw had a runaway in the 120-yard

hurdles, and his superiority was never questioned in the 220-yard low obstacle race. He scored 10 points.

Other Dartmouth point-winners were Johnson, who won the hammer throw; Palmer, who tied with and shares the new association running high jump record of 5ft 11¼in with Horrax of Williams; Noyes was third in the mile, Hoffman fourth in the 440, and Carns fourth in the 880-yard run.

### Fine Work by Bowdoin.

Bowdoin college, which finished second in the race for points, had two good runners in Slocum, the winner of the two-mile, and Colbath, who was second in the mile event; but it was Capt Merrill who covered himself with glory by beating out the field of giants in the shotput, he being the smallest man on the field. The Bowdoin men regard their fine showing as a practical
