## Brown, Holy Cross and Maine Next in Games at the Stadium.

### Five New Records Made, Two Each by N. S. Taber and L. Whitney.

 Dartmouth's track and field athletes ran away with the championship of the New England Intercollegiate Association yesterday in the Harvard Stadium, securing the second leg on the three-legged race by scoring an overwhelming total of 62 points.

The nearest competitor was Brown with 10. Dartmouth and Brown are major place-winners at old Brown, Holy Cross, University of Maine, Worcester and the Institute of Technology combined, these five teams ranking in that order behind the champions.

Dartmouth got its points in 11 of the 24 events, being absent out of the hammer three Friday were Englishmen, the expected winner, failed twice and then got away a throw that carried only 120 feet.

The New England athletes had another busy day for their championships, but even on a field that surely was heavy because of the recent rains, no less than five records were smashed, and several better.

record also was broken in the 10-pound hammer, but not allowed, as the weight was found to be a fraction of an ounce too light, and also to have a handle a fraction of an inch too long.

Four athletes won first places in two events, and two men—N. S. Taber, Brown's great runner, and W. A. Whitney of Dartmouth—leading winning 10 points apiece for their respective teams, also each broke two New England intercollegiate records.

Taber, after having well led in the first 60 yards of the half-mile run, made a whirlwind finish and crossed the tape with yards to spare over Higgins of Holy Cross, Taber's time being in 1:14, which broke the record set by Higgins of Bates two years ago by two full seconds.

In the mile, Taber was even faster, leading throughout the distance and finishing in 4:14, this being his fastest time of the year and a mark better by 2-4 seconds than the old New England intercollegiate record set by Keith of Worcester Polytechnic two years ago, Keith being in yesterday's race and finishing 4:18.

Taber ran the first quarter in 1:14, the half-mile in 2:14 and the three-quarters in 3:12-1/2. He set his own pace and surely will give James of Cornell a great race in the test as well as the mile at next week's championship games.

#### Whitney's New Records.

Whitney's records in the weights were good with men. His winning put in the shot event was 405 lbs., or 25 lbs. better than the 380 record credited to Bartlett of Brown, who was third yesterday with 375 lbs. In the discus, Whitney's new record is 120 lbs., the mark set by Martin, also of Dartmouth, last year at Springfield being 105.

The other record broken yesterday was in the two-mile run, being won handsily by R. W. Arrows of Tufts College in 16:14. The old record was 16:34, set by Newton of Williams.

The winning throw in the hammer was made by H. P. Halsey of University of Maine, who got a distance of 114-1/2 in Friday's trials and who threw slightly over 120 again yesterday.

J. L. Wendell of Worcester was best of the hurdle events easily. His time in the high event was 1:14 and in the low measure he finished in 1:4-1/2 within a fifth of a second of the record held by O'Brien, the Spring Valley member.

C. C. Olson of Dartmouth was the other athlete to win two first places. He won the 20 to 100-yard sprints hurdles of Colby and Springfield of Holy Cross had won trials in 1:14. Then, in the Spring straightaway, Olson did 2:1-1/2 against a mediocre field.

**EXETER NOW OWNS THE CUP.**  
**Phillips Academy Captures the School Track Meet at New Haven for Fourth Time.**

**NEW HAVEN, May 26**—Phillips Exeter was the annual interscholastic track meet at Yale Field today, taking more than half the points. Connecticut Literary Institute was second in the field of eight teams. Exeter's victory today assures the permanent possession of the cup offered by the Yale A. A., being the fourth consecutive victory for Exeter.

Weather conditions today were unpropitious. The air was heavy and the track was badly soaked before a shower drove home. Disappointed track men and today's losers were very fast considering the weather.

W. H. Orr of Exeter broke the inter-scholastic record for the quarter, finishing in 1:14. J. T. Jones, the only runner of the Exeter team that was both quick, which proved the most advantageous event of the day. He won the 100-yard dash by two feet. H. W. Hitchcock of Exeter was the only other man to win two events, taking the high hurdles and pole vault. The summary:
