Frank Kanaly's track athletes from the Institute of Technology, which won the 1917 championship meeting of the New England colleges with 61 points, made an even better total yesterday on Tech Field. Tech made a runaway score of 74 points.

The Tech team was well rounded out, scoring in every event, and in all except three getting at least two competitors counting points. Brown won only one event, but brought up its total to 25 with five seconds, a third and three fourths. Holy Cross and Bowdoin were tied for third, each with 13, Amherst having won 8, Williams and Wesleyan 6 each, Boston College 5, Tufts and Middlebury 2 apiece.

The meeting showed that the New England college athletes have skimped preparation, but the absence of high-grade performances in no way interfered with the competition. Most of the flat races were good.

The only double first-place winner was O. A. Mills of Technology, who won both hurdles. Bauden of Tech was second in both the quarter and half, while in the sprints T. W. Bossert of Tech won the century and R. H. Mullane of Brown the furlong, each being second to the other.

Holy Cross, the only team to take two firsts, besides Technology, had T. G. Luggan win the shotput with 297 4/16. Mahoney won the quarter, while Amherst, Williams and Boston College got practically all their points through first place winners.

Mills won his high hurdle race by about two yards over Thompson of Bowdoin and really running away from the field over the low flights. The mile was easy for Goodwin of Bowdoin, but Herzog of Tech beat Jones of Middlebury in a scrappy finish for second. In the two-mile run Halfacre led from the start. The summary:
