WORCESTER, May 15—Massachusetts Institute of Technology and Boston College qualified the most men in the trials of the New England intercollegiate track and field championships this afternoon at Alumni Field at Worcester Polytechnic Institute. The Engineers qualified 17 and the Boston and Old Maid, St. Williams and Brown each had 10 agreements with the others following in this order: Bowdoin 8, Wesleyan and Middlebury 7 each, Holy Cross 5, New Hampshire State, Maine and Amherst each, Bates and Massachusetts Agricultural College 3 each, Boston College three, Vermont and Worcester Polytechnic Institute 2 each, Colby 1.

Technology's men in the sprints, pole vault and running high jump failed to show strength, while the only disappointment sustained by Jack Ryder's team was the failure of James Caffrey to place in the half mile. Williams and Bowdoin tried up to expectations, and the Berkshire institution has an outside chance of winning the five.

The track was soft, as a result of the heavy rain of the forenoon, which with a strong wind blowing in the face of the athletes militated against better performances. Notwithstanding the slowness of the morning at trials, F. Condon of Wesleyan in the 100 yards high jump was good, for in the fourth of the week the Middlebury athlete ran in 14 seconds. John Dingeldie's quarter-mile in 17 seconds, winning without contesting effort, was another noteworthy achievement. Arthur T. Corley of Boston College ran an easy half with plenty of reserve to spare in 26 1/2.

Two Sprinters Crowd In

Technology had eight men qualify in the sprints and hurdles, in which the amateur contention is expected to be especially keen. William and Worcester being the colleges which are likely to back each other of the track. Boston College qualified Jack Dymond in the 100 yard dash, but he, a few minutes after he ran the quarter-mile trial, had a school holiday to get to Boston College, too, but was seen in the huddle and there are odds he will suffer, as are Tom's men, from the Wesleyan, Williams and Amherst sprints.

The failure of J. A. Merrill of Tech to jump 1 foot 6 1/2 inches high, as did Condon's fall down in the shot, and Boli's weakness in the discus and shot-put, who was the pole vault trial finalist, stand out in the preliminary results. These failures being costly for Frank Kennedy's men.

The outstanding athletes of the trials are E. Locke Robinson of Middlebury, he qualified in the 100 yards high and he hurdles and winning speed jump, he is a strong athlete and a winner, and however the question will be as to his ability to stand the strain of an hour competition.

George Tibbels will have to depend on his own resources, if they come through the strain of the championship, his being to the University Heights men are good. The Old Maid and Brown is strong in the quarter, half and mile, and it is possible that Kirby may stay in the mile run as well as in the half-mile, with an hour's interval between the two events.

Service Entries Barred

Harvard University men to team in the trials, but Harvard is confined to the United Intercollegiate Association and the New England Conference of Amherst member, application for membership had never been received by the A. S. U. C., and it was not allowed to compete. It is believed that Harvard thought the men could enter both the New York University and the Harvard intercollegiate meet, at separate but work when the New York men were not entered.

An excellent performance was the 1000 yard of W. Irving Reid of Brown, who paced 225 1/2 feet, over a mile that was well and a take-off that got the runner lost.

There, however, is somewhat doubtful about J. P. A. Turner, the star sprinter being so far in suffering from a steady gland trouble, which accounted for much Jimmy Smith's start in the 100 yard dash. Left out of these who qualified in the 100 yard 1/2 mile in the 10.

With starting the favorable conditions otherwise, the competition promises to be keen, and it will not be surprising if the quarter-mile record of 17 1/2 made by Donald of Boston College goes to the boards. However, it is necessary for the Boston star to make his record without contesting an all-time record of having one 1000, as is the case at the Tech trials at Colby, and at the Harvard Stadium last. WORCESTER, May 20—Long before the athletes who were participating in the New England intercollegiate track and field championships this afternoon on Alumni Field of Worcester Polytechnic Institute were born, there was a tie for the title between Brown and Amherst on the old Worcester Oval. As a card of thankfulness for the return of the meet to the Heart of the Commonwealth, Massachusetts Institute of Technology and Boston College recalled the tie of 1898 by scoring the same number of points, 24, in the 36th annual meet today. The last meeting in Worcester was back in 1907, after which the scene was shifted to Brookline, Springfield and Cambridge.

Boston College and Technology were looked upon as being closely matched, and after day's trials the indications pointed to success for the Maroon and White. However, there were upsets and Boston College was the loser. On the other hand the things that
