

If the performances of the qualifier in the New England Intercollegiate track and field championships, held yesterday afternoon at Tech Field, Cambridge, is vindictive of anything, the finale, this afternoon which are to start at 2:15 will produce some high class competition.

The struggling for points is going to be interesting, as Bowdoin College, winner of the Maine intercollegiate championships last week, had 15 men qualify for the finale. Maine was second with 13, Massachusetts Institute of Technology 12, Brown 11, Holy Cross and Williams 10, Boston College and Boston University 7, Bates 6, Amherst 5, New Hampshire, Wesleyan, 3, Rhode Island State 2, Massachusetts A. C., North Eastern University and Worcester Polytechnic Institute 1.

The conditions were none too good, a strong wind blowing down the stretch in the sprints and hurdle races, and the hammer throwing circle was soft, making it difficult for the weight men to hold their feet. Notwithstanding two new records were made, Wellington Charles, better known as "Duke" Charles, made new figures in the discus throw with a heave of 138 feet 1 3/4 inches in the teeth of a strong wind. This mark beats the old figures made by Larry Whitney of Dartmouth, 12 years ago, when the big Green star set the record at 135 feet 5 3/4 inches.

Javelin Mark Goes

The other new mark was made in the javelin throw, in which R. H. Evans of New Hampshire threw the "stick" 364 feet 5 inches as against the record figures of 362 feet 8 1/2 inches made by C. C. Brooks of Northeastern University last year when the event was added to the program for the first time.

The first three men in the event beat the former record, showing that the athletes are picking up.

There were many excellent displays of running, but none was more impressive than that of Joe Tierney of Holy Cross in the quarter-mile. He won his heat, in a romp, in 26 3/4 seconds, a performance that is indicative that Jake Driscoll's record of 26 1/4 seconds is in danger of being wiped out. Tierney, however, was not the only protegee of Hart Sullivan's to qualify in the quarter-mile, for Walter Mulvihill and Frank Burns won their respective heats.

The hurdling of C. E. Ring of Maine over the high barriers also was worth while. He was caught in 15 3/4 seconds, a really high-class achievement, comparing favorably with the record of 15 1/4 seconds held by A. B. Shaw of Dartmouth, made in 1908 at Worcester.

Half Mile a Feature

Wellington Charles of Bowdoin qualified in both the shot put and discus. In the later event Jackie Magee had two others besides Charles qualify. The sprint of Bob Foster of Pine Tree State in the second heat of the half mile was hair raising. Although the time was much slower than recorded in favor of Luke McCloskey of Boston College who won the first heat in 24 3/4.

This event promises to be the most exciting today, as Lenora of Tech, McKillop of Boston College, Driscoll of Williams, Corey of Bates, Hearne of Boston University and Leo Lariviere of Holy Cross have all won their right to compete in the final. The summary: Following is the summary:
