

Massachusetts Tech Wins New England College Meet

Thirty-One Points of Engineering Students Beats Bowdoin, Which Finishes Second—Taylor, Hartford Boy, Wins 220 Yard Dash Event

Cambridge, Mass., May 22.—(Associated Press.)—Athletes of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology today won the fortieth annual track and field meet of the New England Intercollegiate Athletic Association. M. I. T. had not won the meet for three years, but previously had won five successive championships. Tech. scored 31 points. Bowdoin, which led in qualifiers yesterday, finished second in points with 26. Bates was third with 16 points.

Williams, Holy Cross and New Hampshire were tied for fourth place with 15 points each. Boston College, which had been expected to challenge M. I. T. and Bowdoin for first honors, barely finished in a 12 point tie with Maine, which developed unexpected strength.

Tufts scored its first run in the first inning after Phillips was walked and Fulton made first on a bunt, Phillips going to second. A double steal was disastrous for the latter, but Phillips made second safely. Shuman then came through with a triple to deep center. The Jumbos scored three more in the third.
