Maine and Holy Cross, expected to be the chief rivals for the New England intercollegiate track and field championship, led in qualifying at the trials, conducted yesterday afternoon in the rain at Tech Field, Cambridge.

The Down Easters had 16 men come through the preliminaries, and the Crusaders from Worcester had 14 who earned the right to continue in action this afternoon, when the finals will be staged in the 18 events that make up the program starting at 2 o'clock.

Island, who was expected to figure, was reserved for the running broad jump, alone, in which he had the best jump of the day.

The 120-yard hurdles saw all the strong men come, with John S. Collier of Brown skimming the high barriers in 15 2-5 seconds, while Earl McDonald of Holy Cross did 15 3-5 seconds. Collier also will compete in the low barriers final, but Paul Tootin of New Hampshire, who qualified in the highs, looked like the best of the contestants going over the low sticks. Lucas of Bowdoin also looked good in both hurdles events.

**George Fast in 440**  
There were no surprises in the quarter-mile run, save that Holy Cross was without John Maher, who was expected to score. He was suffering from a heavy cold and was left in Worcester. Norman George, who has been playing baseball all Spring for Boston University, stepped a quarter in 30 4-5 seconds, and Stanley Earle of Northeastern also traveled in 30 4-5 seconds. Reginald F. Atkins of New Hampshire was the winner of the second heat, and seemed to have much more in reserve with his 31-second time.

The half-mile run saw Francis "Babe" Daley of Boston College win his heat in the fastest time, 1 minute 59 1-5 seconds. In the second heat Russell Chapman, Maine intercollegiate half-mile champion from Bates, whose home is in Quincy, stepped along nicely for a 2-minute performance.

Edmund F. Black, the Maine star, qualified in three events, having the best throw in the hammer, as well as being among the qualifiers in the javelin and discus. He also competed in the shotput, but was shut out. Gowell of Maine leads in the discus, and J. A. McCarthy of Technology was in front in the javelin.

**Thompson Out in Front**  
Thompson of Maine had the best heave in the shotput, and in the running broad jump Talbot of Rhode Island, who won the event last year, had a jump of 22 feet 6 1/2 inches. There were seven qualifiers in the pole vault.

It would seem that the outcome of the meet will rest on how well Bart Sullivan's dash men stand up, compared to the field men of the Maine college. Nevertheless, the competition yesterday indicates that the finals will be very interesting, and that the same standard of performances that has marked the New England intercollegiate meet ever since it was organized, is almost sure to be maintained.

**Eagles, Tech, Well Up**  
Following Maine and Holy Cross in the qualifying of men, Boston College and Massachusetts Institute of Technology had 11 each, Bowdoin eight, Brown and Bates seven, Northeastern and Williams six, Boston University and Rhode Island four, New Hampshire, Wesleyan and Colby three, Middlebury and Massachusetts Agricultural College two, and Worcester Polytechnic Institute and Amherst one each, making 16 colleges which qualified men after the weeding out process yesterday.

The closeness of the struggle between Maine and Holy Cross for supremacy can be readily judged from the 15 events contested yesterday, each failing to qualify in only two, an evidence of the balance that each institution possesses. Maine missed out in the high hurdles and 100-yard dash, and Holy Cross did not get any men in the half-mile and pole vault.

**Purple Sprinters Shine**  
There were some high-class performances yesterday. Jimmy Quinn of Holy Cross scampered through 100 yards in 15 seconds, and he and the other Jimmy, Daley of the Crusaders, lived up to expectations in the two dashes. Daley's 10 1-5 seconds appeared to be much easier done than the "evens" of his teammate, while in the furlong Daley won his heat in 22 1-5 seconds. Norman Bicknell of Boston University also ran well in the 220-yard dash, as did his teammate, Ernest Morrill, in the 100. The latter was the only man who gave promise of making things interesting for the Holy Cross sprinters. Talbot of Rhode

# Wins Intercollegiate Meet

## Collier of Brown Sets New Record For 120-Yard Hurdles Event—Holy Cross Finishes in Second Place Position

Cambridge, Mass., May 19.—(AP.)—But one record went into discard today as Maine romped off with first honors at the New England Intercollegiate track and field championships at Massachusetts Institute of Technology field.

J. S. Collier of Brown University set the new meet mark of 15 seconds flat in the 120 yard hurdles. His feat was all the more creditable as it was done on a heavy track during a down-pour, a combination which disappointed many track fans who expected several new records to be made.

Maine got 31 3-4 points with Holy Cross second with 26, Bates College third with 18 points, and Brown fourth with 17. The other point winners were Boston College, 7; Boston University, 5; Bowdoin, 6; Colby, 6-3-4; Massachusetts Aggies, 3; Massachusetts Tech, 6 1-4; Northeastern, 7 1-2; Rhode Island, 10 3-4; New Hampshire, 10; Wesleyan, 3; Williams, 2, and Worcester Tech, 5.

Toolin, of New Hampshire nosed out Collier in the 220 yard hurdles but finished in fourth place in the high hurdles. Wakeley of Bates took first in the 440 breaking the tape ahead of Atkins of New Hampshire, who pushed him all the way.

One of Holy Cross's "Jimmies," Quinn, took first place in the 200 and also won the 100 yard dash. His pal, Jimmy Daley, finished close behind him in the 100 but didn't get up with those placing in the 220.

Chapman of Bates was forced to the limit to gain a victory in the 880 yard run and was closely followed to the tape by Rogers of Boston College and Fay of Mass. Tech.

The two mile run brought the small crowd to its feet as Richardson of Maine won, with Meade of Wesleyan at his heels. In the one mile run Sansone of Colby broke the tape far ahead of the pack while Talbot of Rhode Island had plenty to spare in winning the broad jump. Summary:
