Maine, favorite to capture the New England Intercollegiate track and field championship, qualified one man or more, in all but one of the 22 events for which trials were run off yesterday afternoon at Tech Field, Cambridge.

The winners of the Maine Intercollegiate title last Saturday qualified 23, and with their distance runners are expected to run up a big total this afternoon when the trials will start at 3 o'clock.

The winners of the dark and light blue led Holy Cross by seven, the Crusaders leading 21; Brown, 20; Massachusetts Institute of Technology and New Hampshire, nine each; Bates and Northeastern, eight each; Boston College, seven; Bowdoin, Colby and Worcester Polytechnic Institute, three each; Wesleyan and Williams, two each; Amherst, Boston University and Tufts, one each.

#### Collier Moves Fast

Because of the strong wind that swept down the backstretch, where the sprinters and hurdles had to contend with the handicap, the hurdles events were postponed until late, but the conditions did not work any hardship on John B. Collier, the Brown under-topper, whose 22.2 seconds over the 220 yards trials was a really noteworthy performance as he ran away and won his heat by 20 yards.

The sprinters did not make fast time because of the wind, but James L. Daley of Holy Cross showed he again is slipping at a fast clip by winning his heat handily, and repeating with another romp in the 220-yard trials.

There were several outstanding athletes, Daley and George Morris of Holy Cross shown in the sprints while Arnold E. Noyes of New Hampshire, after running a quarter-mile in 20 seconds returned later to qualify for the half mile run by winning his heat.

Edward Chapman of Holy Cross qualified in three events, the hammer, shot put and discus, while C. M. O'Connor of Bates qualified in the high jump and broad jump.

The 100-yard dash found things going as expected only Richard of Boston University of the favored ones being shot out. The best time was 23.2 seconds made by Earl Sullivan's two Holy Cross stars. In the 220-yard dash there were no upsets.

#### Quarter-Mile Speedy

There was some fast running in the quarter-mile. Harold Kitchin of Holy Cross winning his heat in 24 seconds, as did Noyes of New Hampshire. John Woodworth of Boston College showed a good flight of speed, winning his heat in 24.4 seconds. The fourth heat was won by Elton of Northeastern, the Eastern Intercollegiate champion, in 25.5 seconds. The double-hurlers had the wind with them on the long stretch to the turn.

Russell Chapman of Bates looked like the best of the half-mile runners, capturing the first heat with plenty to spare in 26.4. Noyes of New Hampshire won the second heat in 26.4 seconds, and C. W. Thompson of Northeastern captured the third heat in the fastest time, 28.2 seconds.

Collier of Brown walked away from his opponents in the 150-yard hurdles. His performance of 23.5 seconds giving him a tremendous margin over the second man, Donald of Williams. K. A. Dougherty of Williams was laid up with a bad knee and did not compete. Jones of Bates and Francis S. Powers of Northeastern were the other heat winners. Over the low hurdles Collier was every bit as polished. There were only two heats and all the qualifiers will compete in a final this afternoon.

Maxey Conant of Brown led the competitors with a pit of 42 1/2 feet, which is better than the winner of the event did last year. In the running high jump six men qualified at 5 feet 10 inches, Morley of Northeastern and the holder of Colby being the only northwestern men who did not qualify. In the pole vault the qualifying height was 22 feet, with George E. Martin of Northeastern leading like the best of the men who specialize in the tall and lanky vaulting act.

#### Jumpers in Close Fight

The competition in the running broad jump was very close, five men being qualified with jumps of from 22 feet 10 inches to 25 feet 10 inches.

"Big" Black of Bates, who is listed with as a sure winner in the hammer throw, threw the weight 221 feet 10 inches, one of the best heaves made by a college this Spring. Ed Flanagan of Holy Cross was second, with 200 feet 7 inches.

B. B. Gowell, also of Bates, led the discus throwers by every bit as with a margin as Black led in the hammer, having a throw of 242 feet 10 inches as the best.

All the qualifiers in the javelin threw best 120 feet, with George Morris, the Holy Cross sprinter, having the best throw, 127 feet 8 inches.

In addition to the regular events this afternoon there will be a madly relay race for freshman teams, which will be run in one heat. The company!
