

NORTHEASTERN PUTS 11 IN TRACK FINALS

Holy Cross and New Hampshire Each Place 12—Robertson Breaks Javelin Mark

LEWISTON, Me., May 22 (A. P.)—The Holy Cross and the New Hampshire track forces, favorites to succeed Maine as the New England intercollegiate champion, ran true to form here today in the trials at Garcelon Field. Each qualified 12 men for tomorrow's finals, with the well-balanced Northeastern team following with 11 finalists.

Bates and Brown each put eight representatives in the title events, and Bowdoin followed with seven. Three colleges had six survivors, Maine, Boston College and Wesleyan, and as many had four holdovers, M. I. T., Williams and Colby. Boston University and Connecticut Aggies finished the day with two finalists and Rhode Island State and Worcester Polytech each qualified one man.

But one meet record fell during today's colorless competition. A new mark was set in the javelin throw when John A. Robertson of M. I. T. tossed it 182.2 feet. The old mark was made last year in Cambridge by Arnie Forsberg of Northeastern, the defending champion, who was only able to place third in today's trials with a heave of 173.5 feet.

Russell Chapman, Bates' great half-miler, encouraged by the perfect running conditions, set out to break Lloyd Hahn's record mark of 1:51 2-3 for the 880. This sturdy champion requires inspiring competition and his record-breaking ambition vanished as soon as he gained a 30-yard lead. His time was 1:55 4-5, the best half-mile he has run since the indoor season.

The fields in the 13 competitions were the smallest in years. Two semifinals were run off in the half-mile to drop off a man and get down to the regulation eight finalists.

The first day's individual honors went to George Morin, Holy Cross captain, who qualified for four events, both dashes, the broad jump and javelin throw. Ernie Knox, Bates, landed in three finals, the 100, 200 and broad jump. The summary:
