Brown and Maine Qualify Eight Apiece—Spinney Wins 100 Semifinal in 10 Flat

With the trial heats and the qualifying rounds of the 47th annual New England Intercollegiate championships completed on Tech Field yesterday afternoon, Boston College and Holy Cross, traditional Jesuit rivals, still look like the teams to beat as the track and field free-for-all goes into the second and concluding day this afternoon.

For a time yesterday Brown's dark horse squad threatened to turn the Eagle-Crusader duel into a three-sided dog fight, but when, in the prolonged discus throwing trials, Tom Gibbane, competing with a sore wrist, failed to qualify, a good deal of the Bears' hopes went glimmering.

Dana Smith Shut Out

Tom had already qualified in the shot, and, ordinarily a 145-foot platter thrower, Brown was counting on his discus points to supplement the efforts of Larry and Roland Brown in the field events, Joe Buonanno in the vault, and Harry Spinney's high-class sprinting.

The elimination of Gibbane—he fouled three of his four tries—put Boston College and Holy Cross out in the van. Each of them qualified 11 men yesterday and the two are pretty evenly matched in those events for which there were no trials.

The Eagle qualifiers include McManus and Joyce in both dashes; Parks in the quarter; Jordan and Daley in the half; Carey in the low hurdles; and Coubig in the shot and discus. Indeed, about the only B. C. man expected to come through who didn't, was Dana Smith, who was just shut out in his 440 heat.

Holy Cross did just as well. Morin, Coakley and Gilligan are all left in the 220, though the Purple has no short sprinter still in circulation; McNally and Morin were one-two in the broad jump; Ring and Winslow remain in the quarter; Cuneo and Garrity in the half, and Reiss in the hammer.

Spinney Wins Heat in 10s

There were several notable performances yesterday, chief among them two sprinting times. Spinney, the dark horse Brunonian, did 10 flat in winning his 100-yard semifinal, the fastest time of the day and only one-fifth of a second behind the meet record, and Bowdoin's one-man track team, Capt Ray McLaughlin, who is staying out of the broad jump but doing double duty as sprinter and hurdler, did 21 3-5 seconds for the 220, only one-fifth of a second behind a meet mark which has stood since 1914.

Brown, despite its disappointment in the discus, qualified eight men yesterday, giving the Providence squad a tie for third in this respect with Maine. Bowdoin and Springfield remain threats with seven men in the lists, and New Hampshire and Williams will be up there somewhere, for they got five men into the finals yesterday.

The finals today will start at 2 p m when the high jump and the pole vault

will get under way. The first track event, the one mile, is set for 2:10 and on the relative positions at the finish of Boston College's Moynahan and Holy Cross' Blake, a good deal will depend. The rest of the program runs along at about 10 minute intervals. The summary:

Boston Eagles Capture Track Laurels Again

Win New England Title With Bowdoin Second, Holy Cross Third

Cambridge, Mass., May 20.—(AP.)—With eight of its 16 men scoring in nine of the 15 events, the Boston College track team today piled up 29½ points to retain its New England intercollegiate championship in the two-day meet at Tech Field. Five of the Bowdoin team, which showed surprising strength, totaled 20½ points to land second place for the second successive year. Holy Cross finished third with 17 points. Maine followed with 15½ and Brown, one of the favorites, trailed in fifth position with 15 points.

Ten other teams figured in the point-scoring, in the following order: New Hampshire and Williams 13 each, Bates 11½. Rhode Island State and Springfield 7, Northeastern and M. I. T. 5, Colby 3, Worcester Tech 2 and Amherst 1.
