

HOLY CROSS LEADING IN N. E. TRACK TRIALS

Injury Puts Joyce of B. C. Out of Dashes

SPRINGFIELD, May 18—Posting 18 entries for the finals, scheduled for this afternoon, Holy Cross' track team led in qualifiers after the trials of the 48th annual New England Intercollegiate meet at Pratt Field this afternoon.

Close on the heels of the Crusaders are Bowdoin, one of the favorites, and Northeastern, each with nine qualifiers.

Maine and Amherst each placed seven athletes and Springfield and Brown each six, but none of this quartet can be regarded seriously in the battle for the crown.

Sixteen college squads are represented in the games, but the rest of them trailed the leaders or failed to place at all.

No New England marks were improved.

Joyce Pulls Up Lane

Capt. Johnny McManus, little red-headed speedster of the defending Boston College team, showed surprising sprinting ability by winning all three of his dash heats, two in the century and one in the 220. The defending 220-yard titlist will meet tomorrow such flyers as Dick Bell of M. I. T., Stuart Parks of Springfield and Wes Knight of Springfield, all of whom qualified for both sprints today.

The bespericled Bell finished second in his century trial to T. Coligan of Holy Cross but he pulled up when he saw his position was certain.

John (Jigger) Joyce, counted upon by the Eagles for points in the dashes along with his leader, McManus, was eliminated when he pulled up later in the 100-yard dash semifinals and did not start in the 220.

Parks of Springfield, known as the one man track team on the Hill, also served notice that he will have a whole lot to say about who will wear the broad jumping crown when he made the best leap of the day. The mark this field will have to shoot at is 23 feet 7 3/4 inches, but he is good for 24 feet. He had one jump of 24 feet 4 1/2 inches but it was thrown out because he stepped over the landing mark by three-eighths of an inch. A. G. Merrin, Holy Cross, the defending champion, is fifth, more than a foot and one-half behind Parks.

Dwyer Far in Front

Dwyer apparently has the hammer throw all to himself, since none of the boys could approach his record toss. He also is a defending champion, but the field will have to throw about 10 feet more to catch up to him.

L. C. Brown of Brown, the javelin king, is being given trouble by S. W. Burgess, a teammate, who is No. 1 man, with a toss of 174 feet 3/4 inches. Brown, however, is still a strong favorite. The summary:

Bowdoin Takes Track Laurels At Springfield

Captures New England Intercollegiate Title, Northeastern Second

Springfield, Mass., May 19.—(AP.)—Largely by the process of collecting 14 of a possible 22 points in two hurdle events Johnny Magee's Bowdoin College track and field varsity today succeeded Boston College as the New England Intercollegiate Association's champion. To the 14 points gained in the hurdle races the Polar Bears from Brunswick, Me., added 12 points for a total of 26 digits. This figure proved enough to leave Bowdoin's banner aloft at the end of the 48th annual meet.

Northeastern trailed by the slim margin of 1½ points. The Huskies from Boston collected 24½ points during the two-day carnival here to finish in second place. Few had expected the Northeastern squad to do so well but the huskies came through with splendid performances when the stakes were on the table. M. I. T. finished in third position with 17½ points; Maine had 16; Rhode Island 15; Boston College 12½; Springfield 11½; Brown 10; Holy Cross 9; Amherst 7; Colby 5; New Hampshire 4; Williams 3; Bates 2; Mass. State and Tufts one apiece.
