

B. C. LOOMS BIG AT N. E. MEET

Qualifies 11 to R. I.'s 19, But All Pack Power

Zelmetz, Gil, McFarland,
McNally, Gilligan Star

PROVIDENCE, R. I., May 20.—Out of the rain squalls and mist which shrouded Brown Field in a damp mantle throughout the day of the 52d annual New England intercollegiate track championships today Boston College's numerically insignificant but pre-conscious athletes emerged to import Rhode Island State's team championship.

The defending champions from Kingston sent 19 athletes safely past the battle-worn rounds of eliminations in 11 events to lead the 30-team field in that respect, but the 11 places with which Boston College ascended to a position directly behind the champions were packed with colossal power.

Zelmetz's Jumps 200, 21-4/8.

Undiminished in velocity since Lee Eagle from the Heights was paired by Frankie Zelmetz, who led the broad jump qualifiers with a lift of 200 1/2 feet and advanced in both dash competitions by Cap Cook (11), who was out 400 feet with much in reserve, then qualified with equal craftiness and restraint in the 800 by Tom McFarland, who concentrated on the high hurdles and appears to be the man to beat.

But it was Hand McNally, on headed hurdles, who was felt to be out of his class in this field, an experience Bill Gilligan and Ed Swenson who ignited a flame which, in its turn, may exchange Rhode Island's reign among the attending brethren.

McNally gave to the finals of his high hurdles tomorrow with a clean-cut and impressive run to victory in the final Gilligan, the unpredictable Brighton sophomore, dug the dust six feet farther than he ever has before to finish as the second slot among the six qualifiers and Swenson secured a steady leave with the green shot. Gilligan, in fact, also qualified in his event.

Polarisling's Big Four

The hammer throw was rapped away by "Shanty" Polarisling of Rhode Island with a prodigious swing of 170 1/2 feet, after John McLaughry of Brown, out of bed by the first time in five days, he shuffled his afflicted feet around to circle to lead Polarisling most of the way with a fine throw of 150 feet, seven inches behind Ed Stark's demolished mark.

But it was the Boston College surge into a commanding position in the wings of a six-man onslaught in the rain and mist that shined its spotlight from Polarisling's feat.

Rhode Island suffered one loss early in the day when Gene Carter, runner-up in the high hurdles race last year, missed his steps between the sticks in his trial and was eliminated by Joseph Dwyer of State and Hand McNally of B. C.

That the defending lists of Dwell were concerned more and more in the day went on is best indicated by the fact that their leg 475 weight—Charles Morris—was gone into the fatiguing dash at the tail end of the program to qualify in his second event.

While it is true that B. I. State has the man power to gain its second consecutive title, it was doubtful any solid reserves should Boston College tomorrow realize full use of its limited, but imposing resources.

Goodell Chief Contender

A dozen men qualified in 100 events apiece, but Zetmore of B. C., Polarisling of Rhode Island and Bill Dwyer of Holy Cross were the only three-event winners. Dwyer's was leading behind Boston Gladding in the javelin, was in a commanding position in the shot, and on his side and went to last three effort King the Holy Cross man took the lead from Gilligan of B. C. by roughly two inches.

Gilligan was "hot." He posted an final effort as well beyond 140 feet and earlier in the day had weighed his big broad jumper around the plate and used it left. He, with but beyond anything he had ever accomplished.

Tomorrow's finale on the turf will provide rare spectacles. "Buck" Quinn of N. H., who will enter a school, will say farewell tonight in a 100-100 double, since he qualified easily in both events. So did Gill of B. C., his arch rival in the quarter-mile, Charles Pope, former Newbury sophomore, listed in second with the sturdy and rugged, also advanced in the 1000.

Larry Stanton of Holy Cross, double dash defender, led all in trial heats, while Tom Crisp of Brown, after qualifying in 179 1/2, unraveled a starting 210, not a leading his low hurdles heat.

The chief favorites were John Goodell of Maine, who led two high and was shot out in the low hurdles, and Ed "Toby" Cook of William, last year's runner-up in the 400, who was scratched via telegraph from the event.

Boston College And Holy Cross Tie As Rhode Island Wins

Providence, R. I., May 21—(AP)—Rhode Island State College won the 52nd New England intercollegiate track and field title on Brown field today with a total of 29 2-5 points, with Boston College and Holy Cross tied for second with 23 points, Maine fourth with 22 1-5 and Brown fifth with 22.

Mass Get Four Titles

The Mass counted in seven of the 13 events and took four titles in making the successful defense of the title that was won with 25 1/2 points a year ago.

Three New England intercollegiate records were displaced. Irving Folwartyak of Rhode Island (major of Portland, Me.) set a new hammer standard at 173 ft., 11 1/2 in.; Antoni Singsen of Brown jumped 24 ft., 8 in., and Ed Singsen of Rhode Island vaulted 22 ft., 10 1/2 in. Thus the Brothers Singsen, rivals through four years of track competition in the two Rhode Island colleges, established new records in vying titles in their final meet on Rhode Island soil. In addition to the Mass-New-England marks, Brown track and field points were displaced in the mile, three-mile, 800 and the broad jump.

Larry Scarsie of Holy Cross and Dirk Gill of Boston College were double victors, Scarsie taking the two dashes to round out three years of undefeated winning in this sectional meet, and Gill taking the 440 and 880 runs. Bill Gallagher of Holy Cross scored in three events for nine points and Kenne Clapp of Brown tallied eight points with a first and second. In addition to Scarsie, Gill and Clapp, six other individuals scored in two events. Bill Smith of Maine won the mile in 4:19 2-5, then came back and finished fourth in the two-mile. Bill Eckhart won the two-mile for Rhode Island with a 3:17 clocking, but he ran the last mile with one shoe off. Moore of Williams finished second in both hurdles.
