

MIT Retains NE Track Title; Bowdoin Man Ties For First

Clarkson In High Jump Deadlock; Parker, Bates, Lands Second In Broad Jump

Cambridge, Mass., May 12—(UP)—Massachusetts Institute of Technology won the New England Intercollegiate Track and Field Championship today for the second straight season, sweeping seven firsts and completely outclassing 12 rivals.

In winning the 58-year-old title for the ninth time, MIT compiled 61 7/10 points, while Rhode Island State finished second with 36 1/2 points, and Tufts third with 19 1/5.

A small crowd braved chilling winds to watch the meet at Briggs Field on the MIT campus.

Bill Casey paced the victorious Engineers, leading competitors across the line in the 100-yard dash and the 220. Casey's time in the first event was 10.5, while he covered the 220 in 23.1.

His teammate, Jack Serrie, copped the mile in 4:27.23, and finished second in the 880-yard run which was won by Charlie Goldie of MIT in 1:59.8.

Other MIT winners were Royce Crimmin who copped the 440-yard run in 50.4; Eob Hines in the broad jump; and George Upton in the javelin throw.

Another double winner was Ed Petoarella of Rhode Island State. He breasted the tape in 120-yard high hurdles and the 220-yard low hurdle, being clocked in 16.3 and 25.3 respectively.

Upset of the meet came in the 2-mile run where New England titlist Duncan Blanchard of Tufts was dethroned by Ed Lemieux of Worcester Tech, an 18-year-old freshman from Hartford, Conn.

Running his first major outdoor race, Lemieux overtook Blanchard at the halfway mark and won by 25 yards. George Bailey and Peyson Luce of Tufts won the pole vault and the discus throw respectively.

The hammer throw went to Elmer Congdon of Rhode Island State while his teammate, Jeff Tootell, placed first in the shot put. The high jump was a five way tie for first place.

Brown and Wesleyan were tied for fourth in team scoring with 8 1/3 points. Others were: Worcester Tech, 8; Williams and Holy Cross, 7; Bates, 3; Bowdoin, 2 1/5; University of Connecticut and Boston College, 2. Northeastern failed to place.
