

Maine Squad Gets 10; Marsanskis Cops Event

Hammer Heaved 174 Feet, 10 Inches; Emerson Ties For First In Vault

Providence, R. I., May 22. (AP)—Winning five individual titles, tying for a sixth and scoring in 10 of the 15 events, the Rhode Island State track men amassed 45 points this afternoon and captured their seventh New England intercollegiate championship. The Rams won last year.

Brown, the host team, finished second with 27 points after winning three titles.

New Hampshire took third place with 20 points, Wesleyan fourth with 15 and Holy Cross fifth with 12.

The other point totals: MIT 11 5/6, Springfield 11 1/4, Maine 10, Boston College 3, Northeastern 2, Tufts 2 1/2, Connecticut 1 1/2, Bates, Boston University, Williams and Worcester Tech 1 each.

Only one of the seven defending titlists, who elected to compete, lost his crown, the ailing Milt Hodash of Brown, 1947 javelin winner, failing to score as Ed Stryna of New Hampshire succeeded him as champion with a 192-foot, 9 1/4 inch throw. Hodash has arm and leg muscle injuries.

The others remained at the head of the classes. Bill Brooks of Wesleyan in the 100, Ed Dahl, Bob Miller, Joe Hall and Bob Black of Rhode Island State in the high hurdles, shot put, half mile and mile.

Black, 1947 two-mile winner also, withdrew from that race and for the first time in many a meet Rhode Island was shut out in the long race.

Despite a strong head wind Dahl scored the meet's only double, taking both hurdles in 15.3 and 25.4. Bill Gould of Holy Cross won the 220, and Royce Crimmin of Brown the quarter mile.

The big surprise was Josh Tobey's performance for Brown as he won the two-mile run in 9:47.3, more than 20 seconds faster than he had ever run the distance.

Dick Phillips won Brown's other first place, taking the high jump at six feet, four inches. Dick Lopes of New Hampshire won the broad jump with a 22 feet, one inch leap; Art Sherman of Rhode Island and Bob Emerson of Maine tied in the vault at 12 feet, six inches; George Mar-

sanskis of Maine won the hammer, with a toss of 174 feet, 10 inches, and George Gallagy of Holy Cross the discus with a 138 feet, 2 1/2 inches heave.
