

# Jones Leads Tufts to N.E. Track Title

Scores 11 of Jumbos' 24 Points to Shade B. U., R. I.; Seffens Breaks Record

SPRINGFIELD, May 19—Bob Jones, mild-looking, be-spectacled Tufts sophomore, boosted his Jumbo track team through a scrambling, suspenseful finish to win the 64th annual New England intercollegiate track championships at Pratt Field today.

Jones took second place in both broad and high jumps, then streaked through the 220-yard low hurdles

in 24.8 seconds to win the next-to-the last event on the program.

Fortified with his 11 points, Tufts then watched nearest rivals, B. U. and Rhode Island, kill each other off in the final 220 yard dash.

Final team scores: Tufts 24 points, B. U. and Rhode Island, 22 $\frac{3}{4}$ .

Only record broken in the two-day meet was the 19-year-old

javelin mark of 199 feet, 7 $\frac{1}{2}$  inches which Bowdoin's Bill Seffens originally destroyed yesterday. The blond junior belted the record by another five feet this afternoon with a throw of 207 feet, 10 $\frac{3}{4}$  inches.

Suspense at the finish was tremendous. Tufts built up a lead via Jones, Bob Backus (first in the hammer and third in the discus), Andy Howitt (third in the 120-yard hurdles) and John Buckley (third in the 440).

But going into the closing 220, B. U. still could win the meet if junior Dud O'Leary finished first; Rhody could win if Alton Wiley and Red Stoll ran one-two.

Wiley led from the break to become the only double winner, but Stoll ran last. O'Leary challenged 40 yards from the tape but finally settled for third, behind Bill Neill of Amherst.

The Terriers showed balance all the way, scoring in 10 different

events, but their only first place was Dick Fitzgerald's glittering mile victory in 4:22.

The B. U. captain from Providence caught H. C.'s Dick Ahearn on the turn into the stretch in the mile and then drove home to win by 15 yards. After a slow early pace, Fitzgerald toured the final quarter in 59.5 seconds to record the fastest mile of his career and the fastest in this meet in 10 years.

## Olney Retains 880 Title

Successful defending champions were Seffens in the javelin, Bowdoin's Don Murphy in the high hurdles and M. I. T. captain Ed Olney, who won the 880 for the third successive year.

Olney won by a stride over teammate Chuck Vickers in the good time of 1:55.2. The pair caught B. U.'s Bill Fitzgerald at the final bend after Fitzie surprised with a backstretch sprint.

Bruno Giordano's assault on the two-mile record of 9:29 failed when the Uconn ace coasted through the final mile. Giordano was all alone after the fifth lap, winning by 50 yards over Bill Nicholson of Tech in time of 9:35.8.

As expected, B. C. Capt. Irving Howe couldn't recover from yesterday's pulled leg muscle in his attempt to win the 440 for the third straight year.

He made a try, starting from a stand-up position to protect the bad left leg, but after 150 yards he pulled up. Vermont's Bob Mahoney went on to win by a foot with Bob Tiernan of Providence getting the nod over Tuft's Buckley for second.

Northeastern's Sal Mazzocca lost his high jumping crown to Bob Jachens of Trinity (6-4), but Mazzocca captured the broad jump from Jones with a 22-ft.-7 $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. leap on his final try.

B. U. busted Tufts' early monopoly in the hammer event when Cliff Blair and Irving Black both squeezed past Tom Bane for second and third place points, but the indomitable Backus produced his best college toss, 173 ft., 5 in. to grab first place.

**Meet Matters**—This was Tufts' first win here in five years - - - Rhode Island's chances fell when the Rams were shut out in both the mile and two mile events - - - Ray Brian's vaulting clearance of 12 ft. 9 $\frac{1}{2}$  in. was a new Springfield record but Bob Linne of R. I. won the event at 13 feet - - - Jachens of Trinity tried to work up to the meet record of 6-5 15-16 in the high jump but he failed at 6-5 - - - Next year's N. E. Intercollegiates will be held at M. I. T., it was decided at the annual meeting this morning.
