

Crawshaw, Paranya Set New England Records

SOUTH KINGSTON R. I., (AP)—Brown University, competing, without its star sprinter Jim Moreland, edged past Wesleyan Saturday in the closing events to retain the New England Intercollegiate AAA track championship.

Bob Lowe took the two-mile for Brown to put the Bruins ahead of Wesleyan 30-26 after the Cardinals had held a 26-25 margin through 11 events.

Third place in the meet which drew 23 entries was Boston University with 20, just ahead of Rhode Island 19 $\frac{3}{4}$.

Connecticut and Maine tied for fifth with 19 each. Maine had been favored to take the team title but weight men failed to come up with the big decisions.

Other team scores: Boston College 17; Tufts 14 $\frac{3}{4}$; Holy Cross 10 $\frac{3}{4}$; Northeastern 8; Springfield 8; Trinity 4; Bates 3; Brandeis 3; Massachusetts 3; Williams 3; Bowdoin 2, New Hampshire 2; New Hampshire 2; Worcester Polytech 1 $\frac{3}{4}$; Central Connecticut; 1; MIT 1. Providence and Vermont failed to score.

High individual scorer was Brown's Angelo Sinisi who put together 14 points with victories in the discus and high hurdles and a second in the low hurdles.

Other double winners were Pete MacPhee of Maine (220 and 440) and Steve Paranya, Wesleyan, (mile and 880).

BU's John Thomas, world outdoor high jump champion, topped the bar at 7 feet on his second try to take his usual first. He had trouble with his shoes and dropped out at that point.

Paranya's 4:10.5 mile eclipsed the old meet record of 4:13.8 set in 1954.

Reid Crawshaw of Connecticut tossed the javelin 241.1 for a new meet record. The old mark—210.9 $\frac{1}{2}$ —he set in last years intercollegiate.

Reid Crawshaw of Connecticut got off a mighty heave of 241 feet, 1 inch to win the javelin. It was the best throw ever by an Easterner and was the third best by a collegian in the country this spring.

UConn athletes took two other firsts and a third share in another. Ed Harrison won the broad jump with a leap of 23 feet, 4 inches and Mel Parsons copped the 220-yard low hurdles in 23.7 seconds.

Gene Bachman tied with Bob Burnett of Wesleyan and George Lanphere of Rhode Island for first in the pole vault at 12 feet, 8 $\frac{1}{4}$ inches.

Spike Paranya of Wesleyan made new records in the mile and half mile. He did 4:10 5-10 in the mile and wheeled off a clinking 880 yard run in 1:52.4. Paranya's mile record erased the old mark of 4:21 made in 1935 by Lou Steiglitz of Connecticut.
