

Northeastern Wins Track; Javelin To Maine's Delaite

BOSTON (AP) — Northeastern University won its first New England track and field championship in 19 years Saturday, taking three first places and scoring in 10 events.

The Huskies' 33 point total gave them a four-point edge over defending titlist Holy Cross, which finished second in the 77th annual meet.

The oldest record in the meet's books, 9.8 in the 100 dash, set in 1916, was equaled and one record was bettered.

TESSIER IN FASTEST 100

Boston College Junior Lucien Tessier of Manchester, N.H., covered the 100 yards in 9.8, the fastest of his career and Northeastern Junior Carl Wallin won his second straight shotput contest, boosting his own mark up to 55 feet, 8 inches.

A seven-point production in the 220 let by Ed Flowers of Newton who finished on top, and Ed McGlaston of Boston gave Northeastern a boost toward victory.

Kevin O'Brien, versatile Holy Cross Junior, was a one-man team as he won the high jump, triple jump, and scored in the high hurdles and fifth in the 440 intermediate hurdles, for 15 of the Crusaders' points.

DELAITE COPS JAVELIN

Maine's weightmen Arnie Delaite of Brunswick, picked up 12 points in the two-day meet, winning the javelin, placing second in the discus, and taking a third in the shot.

Jim Keefe, Central Connecticut's distance runner, swept the mile and two-mile events for the third straight year. He covered the mile in 4:09.9 with Dave Farley of Brown 10 yards back. In the two-mile, Keefe ran the distance in 9:13.9 to finish ahead of Bob Brouillet of Massachusetts.
