sparked by double wins from Chuck Taylor and Johann Murray, captured its first New Jersey State College Conference crown by whipping visiting William Paterson 106-33 Monday. The triumph by the Profs marked the first time in ten years that the title had been won by any team other than perennial powerhouse Trenton State College. The Profs totally demolished the William Paterson squad enroute to the victory, capturing 14 firsts out of the 17 events, including a sweep in the high jump competition. Taylor got the Profs off to a blazing start, winning the 100 yard dash in 10.0 and adding a 23.0 first place effort in the 220. Jim Morales followed Taylor's effort with a 51.1 clocking in the 440, finishing ahead of ex-Pleasantville High standout Bob Zentmeyer. Murray then triumphed in both the 880 and the mile, as the Glass-
