Mankato.-Although winning only one first class and tying for another. Mankato successfully fended its Northern Teachers College conference track and field championship in the annual meet here today.

The winners point total was 60% with Winona scoring 51% for second place, Moorhead 45 for third, St. Cloud 41% for fourth, Duluth 19 for fifth and Bemidji, 6% for

Saints Set 2 Records

Four records were shattered. Norman Bailey of St. Cloud, who set a new mark in the half mile in the 1935 meet, added the two-mile record to his collection Friday, shaving three-tenths of a second off the old mark in running the distance in 10 minutes, 46.3 seconds.

Elmer Johnson of Moorhead cut a tenth of a second from the 120yard high hurdle mark, while Har-Jacobs, St. Cloud freshman shattered the record for the javelin throw with a toss of 179 feet, 8 inches. The old mark, held by Alberts of Winona, was 173 three-quarter inch.

The Winona relay team estab-

lished the other new mark.

St. Cloud Sweeps Javelin

In addition to the record-breaking attempts of Bailey and Jacobs, a number of other St. Cloud men won first places in various events. Jacobs, Captain Debolock and Nelson made a clean sweep in the javelin throw in which Jacobs chalked up a new mark.

Bailey also won the half mile run, addition to his record in the two-mile grind. Captain Debolock copped the discus throw, while Van Steinberg took the broad jump.
