## Phoenix Unseats Hawks In National JC Meet

Despite an all-time junior college record achieved by Howard County Junior College in the final event of the evening—the mile relay—Phoenix, Ariz., unseated the Jayhawks in the 25th running of the National Junior College Track and Field Meet.

The Bears posted 122 points to 120 for the Big Spring team. HCJC has ruled the roost in Juco circles for three years. Phoenix entered the throne room for the first time in history.

Phoenix salvaged the victory by finishing fourth in the mile relay.

HCJC's combination of Bruce Teagarden, A.J. Williams, John Perry and Steve Langham sped to a 3:11.2 clocking in the mile relay. Victoria finished in second place behind the Hawks, more than 40 yards away.

The old junior college world record in the event was 3:12.7, posted by Fullerton, Calif., at Compton, Calif., June 2, 1961.

The meet record was a cozy 3:16.7, registered by Lubbock Christian in 1960. Teagarden was clocked in 48.3 on his leg. Williams made the tour in 48 flat, as did Perry. Steve Langham then brought the baton home in an electrifying 46.9 in his anchor lap.

Blinn of Brenham, Tex., finished a distant third in team scoring with 45 points, followed by Victoria, Tex., which had 35. Hutchinson, Kan., was fifth, with 24 points. Then came Northeastern, Colo., with 22, and Eastern Arizona, with 20. Eighth was Pratt, Kan., with

19 while Lubbock Christian finished ninth, with 18. Grand Rapids, Mich., and San Antonio, Tex., tied for tenth, with 15 points each.

HCJC suffered a jolting loss in the evening's first event, the sprint relay, when Victoria roared to a record 41.1 clocking. The Big Spring team finished second in the event, although it, too, broke the old record of 41.8 by six-tenths of a second.

Langham shattered the meet's 440-yard record with a 47.3 effort. The old mark was set 22 years ago by Sacramento's Frank Kaiser. Kaiser's time was 47.9.

Records fell in six events during the two-day program. Two of the events — the 220-yard dash around the curve and the 330-yard intermediate hurdles — were run for the first time.

Phoenix won blue ribbons in five events — the shot put, high jump, pole vault, high hurdles and discus throw. HCJC prevailed in four — the broad jump, sprint medley relay, 440-yard run and mile relay.

Blinn, Victoria, Northeastern Colorado, San Antonio, Eastern Arizona, Pratt, Kan., Grand Rapids, Mich., and Hutchinson, Kan., each copped one first place.

Victoria's James Tylich hit the final hurdle in the intermediate hurdles after leading all the way and had to settle for sixth place. The event was won by Joe Speer of Eastern Arizona. Tylich had tied the meet record in the race, a new event, in the Saturday morning finals.
