D.—(P)—Barely nosing out the University of North Dakota in the final event by a "break," South Dakota State captured the North Central conference track and field championship here Saturday, scoring 54 points against 53 1-2 for the Flickertails. Three conference records fell and another was tied in the meet which developed into a battle between the two leaders almost to the exclusion of the other three entrants, Morningside, the University of South Dakota and North Dakota State. The decision was made only after the one mile relay which the University of South Dakota won by a yard, but was disqualified for fouling, giving first place to the Jack Rabbits and a sufficient margin for the title. Morningside finished third with 28 points, while the University of South

Dakota had only 181-2, as compared with 64 garnered last year

in winning the championship.
