

Brookings, S. D.—North Dakota university ran off with the North Central conference track honors with 51 points. South Dakota State cashed in for 36 points, to be followed by South Dakota university with 25 points and North Dakota State with 21 points.

Two North Central track records were broken and another tied; O'Connell of South Dakota State went over the bar at 6 feet 2½ inches to beat the high jump record which had stood since 1924; Meinhover, North Dakota U. giant, boosted the shot put mark to 46 feet 4 inches to beat his last year's record by one inch, and Pierce, North Dakota U. speedster, tied his own record set last year when he ran the 220-yard dash in 21.8.

120-yard high hurdles—Won by March of South Dakota "U;" second, Hill of North Dakota "U;" third, McCann of South Dakota "U." Time—:15.8.

100-yard dash—Won by Pierce of North Dakota; second, Hanson of North Dakota State; third, Fait of North Dakota. Time—:10.

Mile run—Won by Bankert of South Dakota State; second, Reeder of South Dakota; third, Vandal of North Dakota. Time—4:49.

440-yard dash—Won by Hill of North Dakota; second, Hokenstad of South Dakota State; third, Newman of North Dakota State. Time—:51.1.

220-yard low hurdles—Won by Fait of North Dakota; second, March of South Dakota; third, O'Connell of South Dakota State. Time—:25.5.

Half-mile run—Won by Nichols of North Dakota; second, Horner of North Dakota State; third, Roda of South Dakota State. Time—2:03.2.

220-yard dash—Won by Pierce of North Dakota; second, Hanson of North Dakota State; third, Miller of South Dakota State. Time—:21.8. (Ties record made by Pierce in 1932.)

Two-mile run—Won by Fosse of South Dakota; second, Emmerick of South Dakota State; no third finished. Time—11:02.

Mile relay—Won by South Dakota; second, South Dakota State; no third finished. Time—3:35.6.

Pole vault—Arneson of North Dakota State and Murphy of North Dakota tied for first; third, McCann of South Dakota. Height—12 feet.

Shot put—Won by Meinhover of North Dakota; second, Reiners of North Dakota State; third, Phillips of South Dakota. Distance—46 feet 4 inches. (New record; old record, 45 feet 7 inches, by Meinhover in 1932.)

High jump—Won by O'Connell of South Dakota State; second, Striker of North Dakota State; third, Fait of North Dakota. Height—6 feet 2½ inches. (New record; old record, 6 feet 1½ inches, by Simpson of Des Moines in 1934.)

Discus throw—Won by Meinhover of North Dakota; second, Messner, South Dakota State; third, Everett of South Dakota. Distance—142 feet 7 inches.

Broad jump—Won by Miller of South Dakota State; second, Hill of North Dakota; third, Hanson of North Dakota State. Distance—22:35 feet.

Javelin throw—Won by Knippide of South Dakota State; second, Pierce of North Dakota; third, Gripentrog of South Dakota State. Distance—168 feet 9 inches.
