GRAND FORKS, N. D. (P)—

The University of North Dakota made a grand slam in North Central conference competition for the school year by taking first place in the loop track meet here Saturday with a total of 40 points.

The Sioux had previously won the football and basketball titles.

The University of South Dakota and Iowa State Teachers finished in a tie for second place with 32 points each. North Dakota Aggies, seventh member of the loop, was not entered.

New Record.

Two new records were posted. Horace Johnson, University of North Dakota sprint star, added an inch to the broad jump mark with a leap of 23 feet, 2½ inches. The best previous jump was made in 1936 by Paul Miller of South Dakota State at 23 feet, 1½ inches.

Ralph Lassen of South Dakota State boosted the shot put standard three-quarters of an inch, tossing the weight 47 feet ¾ inches. The former record was made by Louis Chumich of the University of North Dakota in 1935.

Johnson Stars.

Johnson was also high man for the meet with 15 points. In addition to the broad jump, in which he took but two tries, he won the 100 and 200-yard dashes.

The Sioux took the meet without the services of Fritz Pollard, Olympic hurdler and all-around performer regarded as good for 20 points, who was kept on the sidelines with a leg that has bothered him for a month.

Teachers Score Late.

Iowa Teachers came from far behind in the late events, scoring in the two mile, javelin and high jump.

Linke sprung a surprise in the winning of the 440, with his supposedly faster teammate, Lillibridge finishing third. North Dakota showed power in the sprints finishing one-two in the century.
