

Jack Vaulters Set All-Time Mark In North Central Meet

MOORHEAD, Minn. — Ric Moon and Gary Busch, South Dakota State teammates, both bettered the South Dakota all-time collegiate pole vault record as the North Central Conference track meet concluded here Saturday.

Northern Iowa successfully defended its title by piling up 77 points. The Jackrabbits were second with 62, South Dakota's Coyotes third with 54, North Dakota State fourth with 19 and North Dakota and Morningside tied for fifth with 16. Augustana finished with 10.

Moon and Busch each cleared 15-4½ (a conference record as well) but Moon won on fewer misses. The old NCC mark was 14-5 by Lowell Linderman of N. D. State in 1965. The all-time South Dakota record was established by Moon (15-3) earlier this year.

Deane Bjerke was a double winner for the Jackrabbits taking the mile in 4:27 and the 880 in 1:57.4. His 10¾ points earned him the meet's outstanding point winner award.

Monty Frazier of SDS won the 100-yard dash in :09.6 to tie the 1955 record of former Jack Bill McDonald. However, the mark was not allowed because of a wind factor.

The wind also struck down a triple jump of 47-1½ by Craig Fay of UNI. The record is 45-10¾.

Warren Johnson of South Dakota won the 440 in :50.7 and teammate Jim Foster won the javelin (178-¼).

The Coyotes' John Huth won the 440-yard intermediate hurdles in :55.4.

Frazier also won the 220

(:22.5) and Augustana's Jim Egge was third.

Clyde Hagen of State won the shot put (52-1) with Augustana's Charley Brown and Mike Ratzloff finishing third and fourth, respectively.

Johnson, Huth, John Oliver and Jeff Holbrook carried the Coyotes to a winning time of 3:23.2 in the mile relay.
