Once more has Oberlin walked off with the athletic championship of the state, taking off the honors in the "Big Six" meet at the Glenville Driving park, Wednesday afternoon, in easier style than it did a year ago. A year ago Oberlin won because the Congregationalists had men that could take off seconds and thirds as well as firsts, although Case had the majority of first places to its credit. Yesterday Oberlin led in firsts and seconds and was tied with Case for thirds, showing that there was no fluke to the victory of the crimson and gold. The score in points was Oberlin 68, and Case 47. Kenyon was a fairly good third with 27 points while Western Reserve nosed Ohio state out for fourth place securing 16 points or ten more than the Columbus college which was represented by an apology of a team.
