At no time during the afternoon did it look as if State would lose the meet. Oberlin and Ohio Weslevan did not make the showing that was expected. Oberlin looked extremely weak and had to fight very hard to end third.

Metcalf was the star of the Ober-In team. He ran the mile and twomile races, finishing first in the mile and second in the two-mile. His time in the mile was 4m 25 3-5s, a Big Six record, breaking Baker's mark of 4m He also finished second in the two-mile run after a strong finish, beating Criswell of Ohio State by fifteen yards.

## Copeland Stars in Dashes.

Copeland of Ohio State won the hearts of scarlet and gray followers by winning both the 100 and 220-yard dashes. Day of Wesleyan was doped to win these events, but he did not show his usual form, getting fourth place in each.

Dreisbach of Reserve and Kessler of Ohio State set a new mark in the pole vault at 11ft 3 1-2in. Each tried to go higher, but failed, so that the points for first and second were di-

vided evenly.

Wikoff won the two-mile run after a great race. He made the distance in 9m 44s, one second faster than the Big Six record made by him last year. He was not pushed very hard by the contending field and won over Metcalf of Oberlin by a quarter of a lap. He made the last 200 yards in very fast time and after reaching the tape ran off the field seemingly fresh.

The people who expected to see Case well up in the race were much disappointed when the team did not score more than two points. These were won by Pond, who finished third

in the high jump.

Ohio Wesleyan won the relay race over Ohio State, Oberlin, Miami and Cincinnati. The race was expected to be close, but Wesleyan's four did not have a bit of trouble, finishing far ahead of the field. It was the funning of Kitchem and Garver that spelled defeat for Ohio State and the

other teams. The time was not as fast as in 1911, but probably would have been faster had there stronger competition.

Belt Stumbles, Loses Half Mile. The half-mile race was between Lee

of Ohio State and Belt of Weslevan. Belt led most of the way and was passed by Lee within a few feet of the tape. It is probable that Belt would have won had he not stumbled at the tape, falling against Lee and pushing him into the tape, thereby giving him the race. The time was 2m 1 3.5s, somewhat slower than the

Big Six record. The broad jump was a disappointment. None of the men except Cook of Reserve could jump twenty-one feet and Cook won at 21ft 8 5-8in.
