

BIG SIX MEET

Record-Breaking Affair

Ohio State University of Columbus the Largest Point Winner—Five Marks Lowered.

Columbus, Ohio, May 27.—Athletes of Ohio colleges smashed five state records, and equaled two other state marks in the annual Big Six meet here to-day. Ohio State University won the meet, scoring 61½ points. Oberlin was second, with 39 points, and Ohio Wesleyan third, with 20 1-6. Roads, of Ohio State, set a new state record in the hammer throw, with a mark of 132 feet 9 inches. Another record was broken when Carroll, of Ohio State, finished the half mile in 1:56. The mile was another fast event, and Fall, of Oberlin, hung up a new mark of 4:25½. Dunn, the Oberlin star of the meet, set a new state record for the 220-yard hurdles by finishing in 25 seconds.

The Ohio State University mile relay team ended the meet by breaking the record for this event. The new time is 3:27½. The members of the team are: Ginn, Ferguson, Stephenson and Day. The other teams in the meet finished in the following order: Cincinnati University, 11; Miami, 10; Wooster, 9 5-6; Ohio University, 3 1-3; Kenyon, 3; Case, 2 -13.

The annual interscholastic meet held in connection with the Big Six meet was won by Shalight School of Cleveland high 42½ points. Scott High School of Toledo was second with 23½; Salem was third with 19.

The mile relay was won by Scott High School with Shaw High of Cleveland, Massillon and Bryant finishing in order. A new state record of 3:36 1-5 was set by the winning team the members of which were Page, Fogg, Wetzel and McInnis.

The other teams in the high school meet finished as follows: Asheville, 12; Alliance and Massillon, 10 each; South of Columbus, 6; Fostoria, Perry Township and Newark, 5 each; Rayen, of Youngstown, 3; Walte, of Toledo; Conneaut, Groveport and Pataskala, 2 each; Denison, East of Columbus; Commerce of Columbus, North of Columbus; New Philadelphia and Bryan, 1 each.
