

Four Records Fall in Meet

**Moore Beats Zamperini;
Pat Turner of Bruins
Leaps 25ft. 6 $\frac{3}{8}$ in.**

EVANSTON (Ill.) June 17. (Exclusive) — The Pacific Coast Conference proved conclusively tonight before a crowd of more than 5000 Midwest fans in Dyche Stadium that it is still the home of the nation's finest track and field athletes as it swept to its fourth straight top-heavy victory over the best the Big Ten Conference had to offer by the lopsided margin of 96 to 40.

From the moment Stanford's Clyde Jeffrey breasted the tape on the last leg of the opening quarter-mile relay, there was little doubt as to the outcome of the meet. The far-westerners went on to score clean sweeps in six events and annex four others to win as they pleased.

TURNER LEAPS

Four meet records passed into history, each team breaking two.

Pat Turner of U.C.L.A. got off the best broad jump of his career, 25ft. 6 $\frac{3}{8}$ in., to claim one new mark for the Pacific Coast squad and Oregon's Boyd Brown tossed the javelin 232ft. 7in. for the other.

Big Ten record-breakers were Archie Harris of Indiana, with a discus throw of 159ft. 11in., and the mile relay team of Warren Breidenbach, Jack Leuritz, Roy Cochran and Jack Sulzman which ran the distance in 3m. 11.7s.

MOORE BEATS ZAMP

The Pacific Coast team scored its first clean sweep in the mile run, which was won by Paul Moore of Stanford, followed by Louis Zamperini of Southern California and Phil Leibowitz of Idaho in the time of 4m. 14.3s.

Carl McBain of U.C.L.A., a last-minute entry in the low hurdles, won this event in the time of 23.8s., finishing ahead of Jim Buck of Oregon and Kenny Dills of Southern California to give the Pacific Coast its second clean sweep in track events.

SURPRISE BY TROUT

The far-westerners also swept the shot-put, which was won by Bill Trout of Stanford with a mark of 53ft. 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ in., the broad jump and the javelin. Jackie Robinson and Bill Laceyfield, both

of U.C.L.A., finished behind Turner in the broad jump to make it an all-Bruin sweep while Stanford's Stan Andersen and Don McNeil of Southern California finished second and third, respectively, to Trout in the shot-put.

Behind Brown in the javelin were Martin Biles of California and Southern California's Hugo DeGroot to account for the sixth clean sweep.
