KEARNEY - All it took for the University of Nebraska at Kearney men's track team to win its fifth straight Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference indoor track championship was a lot of personal bests

A whole lot.

"We had a lot of PRs in this meet," said UNK coach Andy Meyer, who was named the conference coach of the year for the third time. "We found out this week Jesse Kruger had a stress fracture in his leg. He's been in a boot all week, then came out and high jumped 6-6 today and got second place. ... Chris Gannon wasn't even going to jump this year. He started jumping a month ago because he missed it, and came out and got second in the triple jump.

"THINGS LIKE that are the reason we won this meet."

The Lopers scored 118 points, while runner-up Western State had 97 1/2

"The last few years ... we knew it was going to be close. But we knew if we did some good things. we were going to come out on top,"

Meyer said. "On paper we were an underdog coming into this meet. But we knew it was at home, and we knew it was going to help us a

Mike Ford won the pole vault (15-2), John Laux the triple jump (46-71/2), Brian Meade the weight throw (57-11) and Allen Burrell the 200-meter dash (21.87).

Burrell also placed second in the 60 and was named the meet's Freshman of the Year.

"OUR MAIN goal was to win the team tittle. We had to get that to keep the tradition going," Burrell said. "There was a lot of pressure on us ... just to get it done."

The Lopers scored in every event shorter than a mile and in all the field events. And, they led from wire to wire, wrapping up the title well before the last few events.

By the end, all that was left was to cheer for the Loper women who came oh so close to making it a UNK sweep.

"We seniors, we talked about it a lot. We wanted it bad," said Leah Lewis, who won the triple jump (38-10 1/4), placed second in the high jump and placed third in the long jump. "We've seen us get second place a lot. But we came out and scored the highest point total the women have ever scored, and we came as close as we ever have been to win it."

The Lopers, who have finished second three years in a row, led until the second-to-last race of the day, the 3,000, where Adams State scored 22 points. In the final score. Adams State won by 17 1/2 points.

"ADAMS STATE probably should have beaten us by 40. But we narrowed that down and beat Western, and Western is a good team," Mever said.

Besides Lewis, Jessica Reinsch won the 60-meter hurdles (8.87) and the long jump (18-111/4). Timmery Nielsen won the shot put (43-83/4) and Megan Holmes won the weight throw (54-61/4).

"Honestly, I didn't even think we would get in the top two," Lewis said. "We knew that getting third would be hard, and to get secand is a Godsend"
