# UNIVERSITY OF COLORADO WINS ROCKY MOUNTAIN TRACK CHAMPIONSHIP IN ELEVEN-TEAM CONTEST

The University of Colorado won the track championship of the Rocky Mountain collegiate conference here Saturday afternoon on Colorado field. Her final score was 49, a decisive lead of 17 points over her nearest competitor, Utah Agricultural college.

Altho slightly outpointed in the weight events in the morning, the Silver and Gold started things off with a rush in the afternoon. Dashes and hurdle events proved fruitful sources of points for the university and the State athletes never were caught after getting a lead from these

The fleet Willard of the University track team was the individual point winner of the day, garnering 15 points from the firsts in the 100 and 220 yard dashes and the broad jump.

A comparatively small crowd of about 1,000 witnessed the meet, in spite of the fair weather conditions. About 160 athletes competed.

Preliminaries in dashes, hurdles and field events were run off in the morning, as were finals in the weight events.

Platt in the weights proved Denver

university's main point getter, as prophesied before the meet, getting 10 points. Colorado Aggies' only chance of a first place seemed a likely one, as Ham Brown hurled the javelin farther than the conference record. The hope sank, however, when Anderson of the Mormons and Croft of Utah Aggies beat his mark.

The afternoon opened with the century dash. The University of Colorado exhibited in this, as in most of the dashes, that she had a capable corps of second and third place men with which to meet the point-splitting onslaughts of Utah teams and Colorado college. Willard did not take part in the quarter mile dash and no U. C. man placed in it. The university's 'old reliables' proved useful in the distance runs, where the Utah entries seemed about to prove the rumors of formidability of the Utah teams.

In fact, the university was having things so much her own way that about the only satisfaction the fans who wanted to see a close thing had was when the university relay team was beaten, Patterson of the Tigers

passing the Colorado man in a tight sprint.
