AGGIE TRACK TEAM TAKES SIXTH; UTAH AGGIES WIN

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo., May 24.—Utah Agricultural college from Fort Logan, Utah, today carried off first honors in the annual Rocky Mountain conference field and track meet here with a score of 61½ points.

The University of Colorado team, winner of the meet last year was second with 32½ points and Montana State college third, with 31 points.

Just as Anderson, anchor man for the Utah Agricultural college relay team crossed the tape thereby winning the relay, feature event of the entire meet, the clouds which had been threatening throughout the day bowed their waters and within five minutes the grounds were before 175 athletes representing tracks, where but a few straggle like colleges of the Rocky Mountain conference had been participating for collegiate athletic honors were drenched.

"Whitey" Larson of Salt Lake City, who had planned to try out for a place on the Olympic team in several field events was prevented from doing so by the downpour and the conference baseball game scheduled for immediately after the close of the meet between the Colorado university stars and the Colorado college team was called off.

Despite the heaviness of the track during the afternoon events due to a drizzling which it received during the time between the end of the preliminaries and the start of the final events, Mullins of Denver university established a new conference record in the 120 hurdles when he scaled one-fifth of a second from the conference record which has withstood the onslaught of conference athletes for eleven years. His mark set for contenders in the future is short at was 15 1-4 seconds. The record has stood for eleven years was made in 1912 by Vincent of the University of Colorado and was 15 3-4 seconds.

The second record of the day to be broken was in the javelin throw when Wallstein of the University of Utah hurled the spear a distance of 144 feet, 4½ inches, breaking the record made by Crandall of the University of Colorado last year by nearly three feet.

Crandall, maker of the conference record last year finished in fourth place today.

Athletes representing the western state normal school at Gunnison, Colo., and Johnson of the State Teachers' college at Greeley, affiliated colleges of the conference, who by the action of the coaches last night were prevented from competing in the track and field events were allowed to participate along with the regular college athletes and their time was taken but was not considered in the awarding of points and medals, the youths merely receiving a time mark which will not even be considered as official by the conference coaches or faculty members.

Bachman of the Montana State university track team, by winning two firsts, taking the honors in both the mile and the two mile run was the individual scoring honors of the meet. Bachman's display of reserve strength when pressed was clearly demonstrated during the running of the two mile event. Taking the lead at the starter's gun he led a field of more than fifteen contestants by about twenty strides.

The event, run over a quarter mile track, necessitated the circling of the track eight times. On the fifth lap, he was seriously pressed by Anderson of Brigham Young university but displayed a burst of speed that put him out in front and for the remainder of the race his lead never was threatened. Many of the contestants dropped out under the grueling test and there were only eight who finished.

Because of the heaviness of the track there were no outstanding performances in any of the track events with the exception of Mullins spectacular finish in the 120 hurdles race. In no other instance was any track record ever in danger during the day.

Montana State university was in the race for the championship honors until after the tenth event with four first place winners to her credit. The showing of the University of Colorado team, winners of last year's meet and heavy favorites to win the meet today was disappointing to its sponsors. The state team took but three firsts in the

entire meet, took one second, one third and seven fourths.

The Utah Agricultural college athletes, winners of the meet, captured three firsts, five seconds, six third and no fourth place in any event.

The chances of the Colorado college team, which was expected to make a creditable showing in the dash events were smothered in the third qualifying heat of the 100 yard dash, when Francis MacDougal, star sprint man for the Tigers and captain of this year's Tiger baseball team, drew a tendon and was forced to withdraw from participation in the other events in which he was entered. As a result of this bit of hard luck the Tigers compiled but four and one-third points during the entire meet, the lowest score made by any of the teams entered.
