

# Utah Aggies Again Annex Conference Title; Utes Third in Close Encounter

## Colorado University Surprises by Grabbing Second; Burke of Local Team Breaks Mile Record; Hurdle Mark Is Shattered.

BOULDER, Colo., May 23.—(By the Associated Press.)—A speedy quartet of quarter-milers carried Utah Aggie colors across the mile relay finish line first here today, and by virtue of their efforts the Utah team carried off first honors in the Rocky Mountain conference track and field meet.

Led at all times and always closely pressed by the University of Colorado, the relay victory, with its ten points, was the deciding factor, the Silver and Gold anchor man trailing across the line for a fourth place in the event.

The final standings were:

Utah Aggies, 49; Colorado, 41; Utah university, 27 1-6; Colorado Aggies, 23 1-3; Brigham Young university, 14; Wyoming, 9; Montana State, 8; Colorado college, 7½; Colorado School of Mines, 5; Denver university, 2; Western State college, 1.

### FIVE RECORDS GO.

Vieting with the spectacular finish of the meet was the number of conference records that went into the discard.

Cox of Utah university shattered the discus record, formerly held by Platt, Denver, with a toss of 139 feet 6 inches. Platt's record was 139 feet 1½ inches, made in 1923.

Wagner of Colorado Aggies smashed the shot put mark with a heave of 43 feet 11 3-8 inches, breaking the mark made by Cox of Utah in 1925, which was 42 feet 9½ inches.

Norton of Utah Aggies paced the two miles in 10:09.7 for a new mark.

Burke of Utah Aggies bettered his own mark in the mile with a timing of 4:31.9.

Wullstein of Utah university bettered the conference mark with the javelin in preliminary trials, although he finished fourth in the finals.

### TOUGH FOR ALLOTT.

Allott, University of Colorado hurdler, played in hard luck all day. In the preliminary heats of the 220 low hurdles he topped the sticks at 24.8 seconds, only to have his record disallowed because he knocked down too many hurdles.

When seven final events had been run off the University of Colorado was leading with 23 points. Utah Aggies and Colorado Aggies had 14 points each.

Each heat in the 440-yard dash counted as a separate event in the scoring.
