OFFICIALS MEET.

DENVER, Colo., May 25 (AP).—Rocky Mountain conference officials, in session here, yesterday approved the proposed organization of an athletic directors' association, similar to the one now in existence in the Western conference. Harry Hughes, director of athletics at the Colorado Agricultural college, was named chairman of a committee to perfect the organization of the association. Other members of the committee are Dick Romney, Utah Agricultural college; Walter Franklin, University of Colorado, and George Cooper, Colorado Teachers' college.

Officials prepared the conference baseball and track schedule for the 1922 season, and adopted dates in minor sport meets. The conference tennis tournament will be held at Salt Lake City, May 24, 25 and 26. The swimming meet will be held in the Brigham Young pool at Provo, Utah, March 15. The Utah state swimming meet will be held at Provo, March 24, and the Utah state wrestling meet at Logan, March 27. The conference wrestling meet will be held at Greeley, March 3 and 4.

The conference track meet probably will be held at Boulder, May 25 and 26.

DENVER, Colo., May 25 (AP).—Eight Rocky mountain conference track and field records fell before the onslaught of collegiate athletes here today in the annual conference meet, which was captured by the Utah Agricultural college of Logan, Utah, with a total of 21 1/2-24 points. Followers of Denver university to win first place in the mile relay race, which they were expected to win, forced the local college into second place with a total of 22 points.

The Colorado Agricultural college of Fort Collins, failed to win the conference meet, finished third with a total score of but 21 2-7 points.

The greatest feat of the afternoon, according to critics, was the phenomenal showing of Haynes of Denver university in running the 400-yard in 44 seconds flat, thereby breaking a record for that event established in 1919 by Carl Cliss of the University of Colorado. His record was 44.5 seconds. The conference record of 43.8 seconds for the 100-yard dash also was equaled by Haynes, who took the lead at the firing of the gun and never came within threatened. As a result of his remarkable showing in these two events, he was spotted to share honors with Beattie of the Colorado Agricultural college as high point scorer, each amassing a total of 12 points.

Beattie broke his own conference record of 45 feet, 3 inches in the shot put by placing the sixteen-pound weight a distance of 45 feet, 1 1/4 inches.

Brewer, by smashing the conference record for the pole vault, clearing the bar at 12 feet 1-4 inch, ousted out the University of Utah from third position. After smashing the record he sought to clear the bar at 12 feet 2 inches, but was unsuccessful.

The track was in excellent condition, and the largest crowd that ever attended a similar meet in the region was on hand, despite a wind which swept the field, and, undoubtedly, added somewhat to the breaking of records, especially in the dashes.

UTE TRACKSTERS MAKE FAIR SHOW

Squires, Pembroke, Pilling Star for Crimson Squad.

DENVER, May 25.—Utah's track men came through fairly consistently in take fourth place in the Rocky Mountain conference track and field meet held in the Denver "U" stadium. Every Utah man got into the scoring column. The Utes split points with the Utah Aggies in the mile run, Burke of the Aggies taking first in record time. Jack Squires tried hard to overcome the lead piled up by Burke in the first three-quarters, but he fell short by less than ten yards. Cliss of Utah was third, beating Lipscomb of U. C. The rebound was about fifteen yards. Jettied his team mate at the finish.

Utah suffered a setback in the 440-yard dash when Burton failed to place and was beaten out of the tape by Captain Pembroke for fourth place. The Colorado boys, Haynes and Mullins, who took first and second, and Wright of B. Y. U., third, were all in under 45 seconds and finished about five yards ahead of Pembroke.

Sey and Squires were not as good as Farrer and Burke of the Utah Aggies, but they handily finished in that order over the rest of the field in the two-mile run. Sey was fifteen yards behind the first pair, who finished together at the tape.

SQUIRES FORCED OUT.

Jackie Burton rebounded himself by winning the 100-yard dash over Lipscomb of U. C. by ten yards. Squires tried hard in this race, but was forced to stop because of cramps caused by his two previous races.

The Ute field man found competition plenty stiff. Washata, the only Montana to qualify in the broad jump, captured fourth place with a leap of 21 feet 12 inches. He was prevented from doing better by a serious leg injury suffered in the qualifying jumps Friday.

The high jump saw Jensen with second place honors. Jimmy leaped over the bar at 4 feet 10 1/2 inches, but an argument ensued between the officials when the bar fell off after Jensen was on his feet and out of the pit. The jump would have given him a six foot first, but was ruled out. Spectators said that the wind blew the bar off, as Jensen cleared it on the jump. Lrons, the other Ute in the event, went out at 4 feet 7 inches.

Budy Lorenz got third place in the shot put on a throw of 41 feet 4 3/4 inches made in the qualifying round Friday. This heave tied with Beattie of C. A. C., who later won the event.

BAGLEY FOURTH.

Bagley of Utah tied with Stewart and Call of the U. A. C. for fourth place in the pole vault with the bar at 11 feet 2 inches.

Dora Pilling, holder of the conference record in the javelin throw, broke his own record Friday in the qualifying round by tossing the spear 204.7 feet.

Lorenz was the only man entered in the discus throw, but he failed to qualify when his best throw was 114 feet.

The mile relay, which the Utes were favored to win, was a disappointment when the Crimson was able to do no better than third.

Jensen, who was Utah's lead-off man, led the field by ten yards at the finish of the first round. Potts, running second, held the lead, but Van Cott was not able to hold his own with the fast Mullins of D. U., and Cortes of B. Y. U., who overtook the Ute at the end of the third lap. Captain Pembroke valiantly tried to overtake the leadlines, but had his hands full to beat Geddes of the U. A. C.
