C. A. C. Third; Beattie Gets Two Records

—(AP)—Six Rocky Mountain conference records went tumbling here Saturday as the University of Utah's well-balanced team took home the track and field championship that was won last year by Brigham Young university.

New marks were established during exceptional performances in the shot put, discus, hammer throw, pole vault, broad jump and high jump.

The University of Utah won the meet with 37 1/2 points. Others finished in this order:

- University of Colorado, 24.
- Colorado Aggies, 11 1/2.
- Utah Aggies, 20.
- Brigham Young university, 20 1/2.
- Colorado college, 21.
- Montana State, 8.
- Denver university, 8.
- University of Wyoming, 2 1/2.
- Colorado Teachers college, 1.
- Western State college did not score a point.

Harvey Sets Record

The new conference marks are:
High jump: Grant, University of Utah, 4 feet 2 1/4 inches. Old mark made by Lee Roy Brown, Colorado Mines, in 1925, 4 feet 2 1/2 inches.

Broad jump: Hamilton, University of Colorado, 24 feet, 4 1/2 inches. Old mark made by Thompson, Wyoming, in 1925, 23 feet, 8 inches.

Pole vault: Harvey, Colorado Aggies, 23 feet, 1 inch. Old mark made by Brown, Colorado Aggies, in 1925, 22 feet, 1 1/2 inch.

Hammer throw: Dutch Clark, Colorado college, 120 feet even. Old mark made by Walter Clark, Denver university, in 1925, 120 1/2 feet.

Shot put: Beattie, Colorado Aggies, 47 feet 9 1/4 inches. Old mark also by Beattie in 1925, 47 feet 2 1/4 inches.

Discus throw: Beattie, Colorado Aggies, 127 feet, 9 1/4 inches. Old record also by Beattie in 1925, 124 1/2 feet.

True to Form

The meet was run under ideal weather conditions. There was no wind to bother the runners or hinder the field men. The final standing of the teams was about as expected. Utah, boasting the strongest team in its history, was an obvious favorite before the meet got under way. The Utah run pretty true to form, since Jackie Squires, favored to win the half mile race in view of his record breaking performance in that event last week at Salt Lake, was second to Levi Myers, captain of Utah Aggies. Myers ran a nice race and finished in a burst of speed. This burst was too much for Squires who had back until the last 100 yards.

Utah placed in 24 on the sixteen events, scoring heavily in the high hurdles, one mile run, quarter mile and high jump.

Grant, however, was the only representative from the western division of the conference who contributed to the record breaking carnival. The other marks were made by the Colorado athletes.

Immediately after the meet, coaches selected Long of Utah university, Myers of Utah Aggies, Plate of Colorado university, and Wooten of Utah university as members of the conference one mile relay team that will compete in the national collegiate track meet at Chicago, June 4 and 5. James of Utah Aggies was named as alternate.

Dutch Clark, winding up a four year athletic career at Colorado college that has been studded with remarkable performances on the basketball floor or football field, was given a big hand by the crowd as he put on an exhibition throw in the hammer.

Grant was high individual scorer with 24 points, and three men tied for runner-up position in individual scoring — Hollington, U. A. C., Beattie, C. A. C. and Ferris, B. Y. U.

The victory was a personal one for the Armstrong, U. of U. coach, in capturing the conference meet. It was the realization of an ambition which he has harbored ever since going to coach at the Utah school four years ago and clinching a long series of championships which he has brought to the institution.

The Personal triumph is all the more noteworthy because of the fact that his material for the track and field this year was little, if any better, than that of last year. Utah's victory was the first in many years on the track and field.

Beattie Sets Two Records In Prelims

Boulder.—Two of the greatest athletes in the Rocky Mountain conference Friday accentuated their retirement from active competition as the annual conference track and field meet got under way with the staging of the preliminaries. The finale in all events with the exception of the hammer throw, took place Saturday.

The two athletes who set new heights in the preliminaries were Dan Beattie of Colorado Aggies and Dutch Clark of Colorado college. Competing in their final meet after four years of active competition they made the occasion a memorable one.

Beattie, in whom records have meant nothing in his four-year of participation, shattered his own shot-put and discus marks. And the Flying Dutchman of Colorado Springs stated his ambition by hurling the hammer to new distances.

There was a touch of drama in both performances. From the beginning of the year, Clark has aimed at the record of 126 1/2 feet established by Walter Clark of Denver. In final meets he has exceeded that distance.

But he missed the official breaking of that mark for his final hours of his college career. With favorites of B. Y. U. inches ahead of him, he took his place in the circle. Around him his friends, who had waited late for this event, had gathered. He wrapped the hammer around his head and tossed the lead ball into the air. It sailed like the air and sang to earth exactly 127 feet from the ring.

Earlier in the day Beattie all about his record-breaking performance. His first unusual performance came in the shotput. He pushed the 16-pound ball a distance of 47 feet 3/4 inches. His second record was 47 feet 2 1/4 inches. Then he established the record in the discus with a throw of 127 feet 3/4 inches.

Beattie and Clark contributed three of the high conference records which were bettered today and all of which should stand into the final tomorrow.

The fourth record was established by that versatile 11th University of Colorado specialist, Darrell Hamilton. The freckle-faced 11th fellow leaped into the air a distance of 24 feet 3/4 inches to break his own broad jump record.
