

Aggies Place Second with 62 To Utah's 73

Denver, Colo.—(AP)—University of Utah swamped a field of nine competitors Saturday in winning its second consecutive Rocky Mountain conference track and field meet.

Coach Ike J. Armstrong's Utes scored 73 points to 62 by the Colorado Aggies, who showed surprising strength in noosing out the Uni-

versity of Colorado for the runner-up position.

The others finished in this order: Colorado university, 65; Utah Aggies, 30 1-2; Brigham Young, 12; Wyoming, 8; Denver university, 7; Colorado college, 5; Colorado Teachers, 4 1-2, and Montana State college, 2.

Only one record was broken. Darrell Hamilton of the University of Colorado leaped 24 feet 5 1-4 inches to surpass the mark he set last year at Boulder, Colo., 24 feet, 4 1-4 inches.

Book Grant of Utah university was the individual high scorer with 18 points. He tied with Millholland, of Colorado Teachers for first place in the high jump at 8 feet, 2 1-2 inches. This jump was one inch short of the Rocky Mountain conference record set by Grant last year.

Grant was second in the broad jump, third in the low hurdles and first in the high hurdles.

Utah virtually won the meet by scoring six first places and tying for first in another, but it counted heavily in the one-mile run. Bessy winning that event, was followed

by Lusty, Ivie and Cowan, all of Utah in that order.

Colorado Aggies, always strong in the field events, forged into second place by picking up several points on the track and in the distance runs. Haynes, the Aggie sprinter, also helped the Farmer cause by beating out a strong field in the 220-yard dash. Long, of Utah, the favorite in this race, finished third.

One of the disappointments as far as Colorado Aggies were concerned was the failure of Harvey, the conference record holder in the pole vault, to do better than 12 feet, 4 inches. This caused a three way tie in that event, but the Aggies lost no points because Riddell, of C. A. C., and Staples, of B. Y. U. also jumped 12 1-2 feet.

The most sensational race of the day was that in the quarter mile where Long of Utah beat out Levi Myers, the Utah Aggie captain. Myers held the lead until the last 20 yards, where Long, with a burst of speed passed him up and won with three yards to spare. The time was slow, almost a full second slower than the Rocky Mountain conference record of 47.8 established by Myers last week at Provo, Utah.

Utah's triumph was a record in itself. It marked the first time in history that one school won three major athletic championships in one year. Utah won its third consecutive football championship last fall, followed it up by beating Wyoming for the basketball championship and Saturday made it two years in a row in track.

The meet was run under ideal weather conditions. The track was hard and fast, and there was no wind. The athletes worked out under a warm sun.
