# C. A. C. WINS CONFERENCE TRACK TITLE

## Utah U. Comes Second, B. Y. U. Third of 11 Schools.

The Rocky Mountain conference track and field meet championship went back to the eastern side of the conference slope Saturday, when the Colorado Agricultural college wrested the 1932 meet away from the determined onslaught of Utah university and the B. Y. U. and eight other schools. The Colorado team supplanted Utah as the conference champions.

Brigham Young university, although placing 24 men in the trials Friday, and surprising with a second place in the hammer throw, held on Friday, failed to live up to the pre-meet predictions and came out third with 39 1-10 points.

The meet was run under both adverse and exceptionally good weather conditions; the good condition being the 8 1/2 mile wind blowing at the backs of the 100-yard dash men. This wind enabled Greenwell of Utah to run the hundred in 9 and 8-10 seconds (tying the world's record, although the record will not be allowed to stand. Greenwell surprised everyone in this race by winning from his brilliant teammate, Wright, and Hutchinson, "Y."

After the hundred and the high hurdle races were run, the wind reversed and made the running conditions bad, and the times comparatively slow.

Ivan Dykeman proved a powerful factor in the win of the Colorado team, and recalled meets in which B. Y. U.'s Owen Rowe was a "one-man team." Dykeman accounted for 12 of the winning team's points, winning first in the hammer, second in the high hurdles, and third in the discus.

Brad Jensen of the B. Y. U. ran a pretty race in the half-mile, taking it by five yards in the time of 1:59 1-0. This is exceptionally fast time considering the weather conditions.

Lamar Taylor accounted for the other first place for the "Y" team, taking the mile in 4:32 8-10. Taylor placed fifth in the two-mile

but his teammate, Snyder failed to place.

Utah University runners wore goggles to protect themselves from the flying cinders. The wind blew the dust at such a rate at times that it was difficult for the runners to see where they were going. The reversal of the wind from good to bad came after the 100-yard dash and the high hurdles were run.

The discus and the low hurdles proved the big point winners for the Colorado team.
