C. U. Second; Powers Breaks Record in 100

Denver.—(AP)—The versatile University of Utah Utes regained the Rocky Mountain conference track and field championship here Saturday nosing out the University of Colorado, 44 to 41½ points by winning the mile relay in the concluding and deciding track event of the meet.

Colorado Aggies, dethroned titleholders, finished third with a 39½ point total, and Brigham Young university was not far away in fourth place with 39 1-6 points.

Lenny Powers, Denver university speed merchant, won individual scoring honors with 10 points, representative of two firsts in the 100- and 200-yard dashes.

Powers also was responsible for the lone record which was shattered. The century dash which he traveled in 9.6 seconds to replace the 9.7 mark set by Albers of Denver in 1928.

The final standings follows:

Utah, 44; Colorado, 41½; Colorado Aggies, 39½; Brigham Young, 37 1-6; Denver, 32; Utah State college, 19; Colorado college, 9; Colorado Teachers, 6; Montana State, 5; Colorado Mines, 5.

Utah's triumph, which marked a clean sweep for the western division in athletic competition with schools on this side of the Rockies this season, was made singular by the fact the Utes acquired only two firsts.

Davies won the javelin for the new cinder kings with a toss of 186 feet 6 inches, and the mile relay went to the Redskins in the time of 3:23.

The Utes, however, demonstrated the balance of their track squad by

picking up four second places, the same number of thirds, two fourth positions and a lone fifth.

Denver won three firsts, Colorado Aggies each won a pair of firsts and split with Brigham Young for another in the pole vault, and Utah Aggies won a pair of first places, Colorado Teachers, Mines, Montana state and Colorado college each accounted for one first.

Altho only one record was broken, three others were endangered.

Holst of Montana State won the two miles as he pleased and failed establishing new figures in the record book because of the lack of competition. His time was 9:50.4, only two-tenths of a second slower than the record.

Morris of the Colorado Aggies in capturing the 220-yard low hurdles in 23.6, came within one-tenth of a second of the conference mark.

Johnson of Colorado Mines leaped 6 feet, 2¾ inches to win the high jump, only a short distance under the record of 6 feet, 3¾ inches.

Smith of Colorado Teachers had easy sailing in the 440-yard dash,

and Larson of Colorado college set a fast pace to lead all the way in the 880.

Powers exhibited marked superiority in the dashes over Greenwell and Goldstein, crack Utah sprinters, by winning both events. The Utah stars ran the 100 in 9.7 in the preliminaries Friday, but outdistanced at the start of both the century and 220 Saturday failed to perform in their best fashion.

At the start of the mile relay Utah was leading with 37½ points, but, with the pole vault also to be completed, were hard pressed by Colorado with 34 tallies, Colorado Aggies with 32½ and by Brigham Young with 35 1-6.

Powers and Beausang kept Denver ahead for the first two laps of the relay, but on the third time around the track, Hartenstein took a wide lead and Jeppson continued the good work to win the event.

The pole vault, which was completed as the relay was concluded, ended in a three-way tie between Colorado Aggies, to make Utah's victory definite.

Utah also won the conference football title this season, and Utah Aggies the basketball crown to shut out the eastern division in major sports conflict this season.
