

USC wins RMAC trackfest

Two Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference records fell as the University of Southern Colorado ran away from the field to win the conference track meet held Saturday at Dixie College.

Southern Utah State was the host for the meet, but the meet was held at Dixie College because the new track facilities at the Cedar City school have not yet been completed.

Richard LeDoux of Southern Colorado set a new conference mark in the steeplechase with a 9:24.70 performance, breaking the old record held by Mark Weeks of Adams State at 9:50.3.

The other conference record broken was by the 440-yard relay team from Western New Mexico. Team members Robert Spears, Chano Talavera, Ivan DeAnda and Charles Cook combined for a winning time of 42.10, breaking the old record of 42.3 held by a team from Western New Mexico.

Southern Colorado amassed 185 points to easily outdistance Western New Mexico which had 100 points. Southern Utah State finished sixth out of seven teams with 72 points.

The only first place finish for SUSC was in the javelin where Robert Shirts threw the spear 213-feet 3-inches.
