

# Tiger men honored, place second at RMAC Championships

## Three RMAC titles for FHSU women in third-place finish

ALAMOSA, Colo. — Adams State (Colo.) College set a Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Championships record on both the men's and women's side to sweep the track and field titles on Tuesday, scoring 250 and 263 points, respectively.

Fort Hays was second on the men's side with 197½ points, while the women took third with 113½.

Tiger senior Joe Wurtz was named the Athlete of the Meet for his performance while junior Maurice Henson, running track for the first time in college, was named the RMAC Freshman of the Year.

Conference champions for the Tiger men were sophomore Zach Brown, who won the 200-meter dash in 21.12 seconds; Brown, sophomore Aaron Pablo, senior Casey Antholz and sophomore Jamall Gaines, who continued their domination of the 400-meter relay; senior Matt Bixenman in the high jump with a leap of 6 feet, 9 inches; junior Sheldon Funk who won the pole vault at 16-6; junior Maurice Henson who beat second place by more than one foot to take the triple jump title at 48-41/2; senior Jeremiah Huyett, with a throw of 191-9 in the javelin and Wurtz in the hammer throw at 178-7.

Women's champions were senior Kollisa McVay in the pole vault at 11-1; freshman Megan McClain in the 400-meter hurdles in 1:04.03 and senior Tara White in the javelin with a throw of 132-6.

All-RMAC honors went to the top three finishers in each event. On the men's side for the Tigers, that included Antholz, who took second in the 100-meter dash; Brown, second in the 400; sophomore Nate Stroup, who was third in the 110-meter hurdles; Henson was second in the high jump and third in the long jump; Juniors Dustin

Hamilton and Chad Burks who completed the sweep of the pole vault; senior Chris Gannon, third in the triple jump; sophomore Josh Wendland and freshman Chase Rogers, who took second and third in the javelin, while Wurtz was third in the discus at 158-9 and second in the shot put at 50-6.

For the women, freshman Megan McClain took third in the 100; freshman Ashley Dopita in the 400-meter hurdles was second; junior Jolene Hoffman, sophomore Kara Boyd, sophomore Morgan Riekenberg and McClain, third in the 400-meter relay; Dopita, McClain, Boyd and junior Cara MacDonald, third in the 1,600-meter relay; senior Cristy Hall was second in the hammer throw with a toss of 163-5 and senior Amy Farlee was second in the javelin, six inches behind White at 132-0.

Fort Hays now travels to Emporia on Saturday for the Emporia State University Qualifier. The NCAA II National Championships are in Abilene, Texas, on May 26-28.
