Tiger Tracksters Take League Title

Coach Payton Jordan's Occidental College tracksters—the Calumets of the small colleges—came within a point and one half of equaling the combined totals of the other four institutions as they swept to their fifth straight Southern California Intercollegiate Conference championship on Patterson Field yesterday.

The Tigers, competing before 2500 fans, broke two meet records and tied another as they rolled up 81 points, 53 more than second-place Whittier's 28. Pomona with 25¼, Redlands with 17¼ and Caltech with 13¼, followed.

Although there was lead in the skies, there wasn't any in the Tigers' trousers and Long John Barnes, Oxy's middle-distance sensation, broke a record in the day's first final, the mile, galloping the distance in 4m. 20.9s. His effort surpassed the 4m. 24.3s. mark established by the late Marine aviator, Clair Berdel of San Diego State, in 1938.

Blazin' Bill Parker tied his

own 440 record of 48.6s. and then came back to run a torrid 47.7s. anchor lap on the record-breaking four-man mile relay team.

The Tiger quartet, which will run in the Drake Relays at Des Moines, Ia., Saturday, sped the four laps in 3m. 18.4s., smashing the 12-year-old record of 3m. 21.1s. set by another Oxy team in 1939.

Kamanski Runs

Dave Kamanski, who needed additional points to get his letter. was allowed to start for the Oxy foursome in the place of Wilbur Cotrel. Kamanski, clocked in 53.8s., was in last place when he passed the baton to McKibben. who earlier had flashed to an Oxy furlong record of 21.1s. McKibben, pulling out all the stops, made up at least 50 yards on the field and took over the lead for keeps at the 220 mark. He was timed unofficially in 17.7s. when he gave the baton to Barnes. Barnes toured a 49.1s, lap and passed to Parker who whizzed his quarter in 47.7s.
