

Xavier of New Orleans Wins Meet With Total of 77 Points

Seven records were broken in the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference track meet which Xavier University of New Orleans won here Saturday with a total score of 77 points.

Alabama State, located at Montgomery, took second place with 42½ points; Morehouse, Atlanta, was third, with 21, and Morris Brown, Atlanta, fourth, with 13½.

Trailing Morris Brown came Tuskegee Institute, Tuskegee, Ala., with an even dozen points. Other schools in competition were Fort Valley State, Fort Valley, Ga., Talladega, Talladega, Ala., and Fisk, Nashville, Tenn.

The conference is made up of the principal Negro schools and colleges throughout the South.

The new records were as follows:

120 yard hurdles, 14 feet, 6 in., old record, 14 feet, 7 in.

220-yard hurdles, 23 feet, 5 in., old record, 23 feet, 6 in.

Mile run, 4:18.9; old record, 4:24.1.

Running broad jump, 23 feet, 11 in.; old record, 23 feet, 6½ in.

High jump, 6 feet, 6¾ in.; old record, 6 feet, 5¼ in.

Javelin throw, 188 feet, 7½ in.; old record, 186 feet, 8 in.

Pole vault, 13 feet, 2¼ in.; old record, 12 feet.

A Morehouse student, Ulysses Amos, carried off individual high score, with 11 points, but was pressed by Edward Culp, of Xavier and Leo Tarrant, of Alabama tied with 10 points each; James Haines, of Morehouse had eight; Theodore Baugh, Alabama, 7, and Claude Paxon and Gilder Farrow, both of Xavier, scored six points each.
