

Florida A&M, although not as powerful in depth as in previous championship years, was still versatile enough to dominate the 26th Annual SIAC Track and Field Championships, Saturday at Cheney Stadium.

Forced to the acid test, by crack runners from Allen University and Morehouse, the Orange and Green Rattlers withstood spirited challenges to win the 400 yard relay, one mile run, 100, and 220 dashes, and the mile relay. The Rattlers piled up 58 points to edge out Morehouse with 27. Clark College had 27 points. Allen 20 and Fort Valley State 13.

Alfred Austin of FAMU cracked the only record of the day in spearing the javelin 202 feet 10 inches to erase the old masterpiece set by E. Robinson in 1951.

Robert Harris, who won the 100 and 220 runs and did a masterly job of his leg in the mile relay was voted the most valuable performance. He received the Cleveland Leigh Abbott Memorial Trophy for his splendid performance.

James Brown of Tuskegee Institute won the Isaac Newton Harvey Memorial Trophy for his winning the 440 yards run by a hairlash over Alfred Austin of Florida A&M.

It was a perfect evening for track and field and Frank Murray of Florida A&M used it to surprise favored David Walker in the mile with a 4:23. 3 timing.

Walker came back to defeat Murray in the two mile run with a 10.2.5 clocking.

Charles Smith, Clark College, won the 120 high hurdles in a photo finish over William Crews of Alabama State in .15 ten-seconds.

George Harold, Allen University won the 220 low hurdles with a 10' 2-5' clocking.

Florida A&M won the mile relay behind Lynwood Dickerson, Leonard Kelley, Robert Harris and Ceaser Austin to defeat Allen University, Alabama State and Tuskegee Institute. Authur Walker of Morehouse won the high jump with a leap of 6. feet .4 inches.
