Four Records Broken—

# Cortland Romps in State Conference Meet; Oswego Fourth Among 10 Colleges

Although the sun failed to shine on SUNY, the State University of New York Athletic Conference men's track & field championships went off almost without a hitch Saturday at South Athletic Field, where four SUNY records were broken despite bad weather.

Kenneth P. Peterson, meet director and his large staff, called off the pole vault because of dangerous condition created by continual rain which swept in sheets across the field. The all-weather Oswego running track, however, helped support two records, while SUNY athletes ignored slippery infield conditions and set two more marks in the discus throw and shot put.

Ironically, one of the records wiped out came in the 120-yard high hurdles, won by Brockport's Steve Schultz in 15.2 seconds. The record he broke was 16.4, and it was set by the Lakers' former hurdles ace, Hal Perry in 1969, the last time the meet was held. Perry's other mark, however, in the 440-yard intermediate hurdles, was safe by a full second from winner Jim VanAuker of Brockport, who was clocked in 56.6 seconds.

The other running record came in the three-mile run, won by Cortland's Phil Bonfiglio. He splashed around in 14:53.5 minutes.

Field events were highlighted

by records in the discus by Cortland's Tony Steigerwald and in the shot by Cortland's Al Brunetti. Steigerwald sailed the plate 140 feet, 9½ inches, wiping out the record he set for SUNY two years ago of 135-7. Brunetti put the shot 46 feet, 7¾ inches, bettering the 1969 mark of Brockport's Al Halley who put it 45-6½.

Cortland ran away with the meet, posting 79 points, leaving Brockport second with 46, Buffalo State third with 40 and Oswego fourth with 32. The rest of the field included Oneonta, 26; New Paltz, 16; Fredonia, 13; Potsdam, 4, Plattsburgh 0 and Geneseo, 0.

Winners of other events included Cortland in the 440 relay, 43.0 seconds, Bob Goodell (Brockport) in the mile, 4:27.2 minutes; Ed Leone (Oneonta) in 440, 51.7; Steve Lashbrook in 100 yard dash, 10.2; Gene Foster (Oneonta) in the 880 run, 1:57.3; Pete DeFina (Cortland) in 220 dash, 22.3; and Buffalo State in the mile relay, 3:27.7.

Field events first place medalists included long jumper Bob Revins (Cortland), 20' 11½"; high jumper Steve Suto (Cortland), 6' 4"; javelin throw Tim Stolte (Oswego), 160' 10"; and triple jump, Randy Smith (Buffalo State), 43' 10½".

In addition to Stolte's first place medal, Oswego also picked up three seconds, with hFern Swager in the mile, Joe Petrelli

Suárez also had a third place medal for his run in the three-mile, while Steve Buso got one for his leap in the high jump, which meet officials moved indoors to the field house and held on the dry but slippery astroturf.

Brian Wade had a fourth for the Lakers in the 120-yard high hurdles, while in the 100 yard dash, Fred Ammann contributed the fifth place point to the Oswego effort as did Bill Tylutki in the three-mile.

The field of 10 squads with well over 200 athletes was delighted with everything in Oswego but the weather. The smoothly organized meet often times ran ahead of schedule and coaches got their athletes in and out of area restaurants and back on the road home before the evening dinner hour was over.
