

The Tar Heels scored 68 13-14 points, more than twice as many as Virginia's 34 5-14 which took second place. Maryland was third with 30, Duke had 27 3-7, South Carolina 20 3-7, Clemson 20, Washington and Lee 10 6-7, N. C. State eight, and V. M. I. five. The tenth conference school, V. P. I., did not enter.
