Durham, May 21.—(AP)—Summaries of the finals of the 16th annual Southern Conference track and field championships:

**Shot put**—Won by Strickler of V. M. I., 48 feet 4 $\frac{1}{4}$  inches; second, Fischer of Duke, 47 feet 8 $\frac{1}{8}$  inches; third, Craig of South Carolina, 46 feet 5 $\frac{1}{2}$  inches; fourth, Juliber, of North Carolina, 42 feet 4 $\frac{1}{2}$  inches; fifth, Morrison, of Richmond, 42 feet 2 $\frac{3}{4}$  inches. (New record, old record 47, 9 $\frac{3}{4}$  set by Strickler in 1937).

**One mile**—Won by Davis, of North Carolina; second, Kehoe of Maryland; third, Chromister of Maryland; fourth, Davis of N. C. State; fifth, Calhoun of Clemson. Time, 4 minutes 17.5 seconds.

**Javelin**—Won by Sullivan, of Duke, 184 feet 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ ; second, Hilton, of North Carolina, 175 feet 9 $\frac{3}{4}$  inches; third, Sinar, of Richmond, 175 feet 8 $\frac{1}{4}$  inches; fourth, Johnson of Davidson, 171 feet 5 inches; fifth, Clark, of Duke, 165 feet 2 inches.

**440 Yard**—Won by Cronin, of Maryland; second, Mast, of V. P. I.; third, Ragon, of Washington and Lee; fourth, Naudain, of Duke; fifth, Theis, of Maryland. Time, 48.3 seconds.

**100 Yards**—Won by McAfee of Duke; second, Reavis of Duke; third, Herring of V. M. I.; fourth, Curl of Washington and Lee; fifth, Rodgers of North Carolina. Time, 9.9 seconds.

**High jump**—Won by Miller of Maryland, 6 feet, 1 inch; second, Winborne of North Carolina, 5 feet, 10 inches; third, tie between March of North Carolina and McColl of North Carolina, 5 feet, 8 inches; fifth, tie between Saxe of V. M. I. O'Flaherty of Richmond, Bowman of Duke, Black of Davidson, 5 feet, 6 inches.

**120-Yard high hurdles**—Won by Kinzle of Duke; second, Corpening, of North Carolina; third, Rogers of Washington and Lee; fourth, Graham of North Carolina; fifth, Evans of Maryland. Time, 14.5 seconds. (New record. Old record, 14.8 seconds, set by Abernathy of North Carolina in 1935).

**Discus**—Won by Craig of South Carolina, 143 feet, 7 inches; second, Shockey of V. P. I., 142 feet, 10 inches; third, Williams of Davidson, 141 feet, 10 inches; fourth, Fiedler of V. M. I., 132 feet, 3 $\frac{1}{2}$  inches; fifth, Morrison of Richmond, 127 feet, 5 inches.

**880 Yards**—Won by Headley of Maryland; second, Hendrix of Carolina; third, Davis of North Carolina; fourth, Harvey of Washington and Lee; fifth, Johnson of Duke. Time 1 minute 53.3 seconds. (New record. Old record, 1 minute 55.8 seconds, set by Gees of Kentucky in 1928).

**220 Yards**—Won by Herring of V. M. I.; second, McAfee of Duke; third, Reavis of Duke; fourth, Curl of Washington and Lee; fifth, Deaton of North Carolina. Time, 21.4 seconds.

**Broad jump**—Won by Corpening of North Carolina, 22 feet, 10 inches; second, March of North Carolina, 22 feet, 1 $\frac{1}{4}$  inches; third, Kenney of Maryland, 21 feet, 9 inches; fourth, McAfee of Duke, 21 feet, 7 $\frac{1}{2}$  inches; fifth, Kinzle of Duke, 21 feet, 7 $\frac{1}{4}$  inches.

**220-Yard low hurdles**: Won by Kinzle of Duke; second, Reavis of Duke; third, tie between Evans of Maryland and March of North Carolina; fifth, Corpening of North Carolina. Time, 23.5 seconds. (New record. Old record, 23.6 seconds, set by Everett of Virginia in 1935).

**Mile relay**—Won by Maryland (Theis, A. Miller, Headley and Cronin); second, Duke; third, North Carolina; fourth, V. P. I.; fifth, Washington and Lee. Time, 3 minutes 20.3 seconds.

**Two mile**—Won by Peaslee of Maryland; second Jones of North Carolina; third, Marsh of William and Mary; fourth, Hall of North Carolina; fifth, Gordon of North Carolina. Time, 9 minutes, 53.5 seconds.

**Pole Vault**—Tie for first between Cronin of Maryland and Ellis of V. P. I., at 12 feet, three inches; third, Fort of Davidson, 12 feet; fourth, tie between Dukley of North Carolina, Woodson of North Carolina and Stoneburner of Richmond, 11 feet, 6 inches.
