

Williamsburg, Va. (AP).—A versatile, sixteen-man Duke University squad wrested the Southern Conference track championship from North Carolina's defending titleholders, 66 to 58 5-6 yesterday in a strictly two-way battle which left other schools hopelessly out of the running.

North Carolina's Tar Heels, who had dominated the conference cinder paths since 1938, attempted to overcome Duke's overwhelming superiority in the field events by sending a big 42-man squad into the struggle but relinquished the crown at low hurdles, when Ed Sargent and Moffatt Storer, both of Duke, finished one-two ahead of Carolina's hurdling duo, Warren Mengel and Mike Mangum.

Maryland trailed well back in third place with 26 points and Richmond was fourth with 17 5-6. Other scoring schools were, V. M. I., 13; William and Mary, 10; Clemson, 7; Virginia Tech, 7; Washington and Lee, 6; Wake Forest, 5½; Davidson, 3 1-3; N. C. State, 2½; and South Carolina, 2.
