

TAR HEELS SCORE DECISIVE VICTORY IN INDOOR GAMES

Four New Records Among Carolina's Five First Places in S. I. C. Meet

CAROLINA COUNTS 37.2 POINTS IN TAKING MEET

Generals Second with 18.7; Carolina Frosh Win Year- ling Events and Greensboro Takes Scholastic Meet; Mc- Ginn of State, Simons and Fulmer, Duke, Win Firsts

Tin Can, Chapel Hill, March 7.—(AP)—The University of North Carolina Tar Heels romped away with the Southern Conference indoor games tonight, taking five first places, four of which set new conference marks.

Bob Fetzer's Tar Heels tallied 37.2 points and Washington and Lee, last year's winner, was second with 18.7.

Other team scores: Alabama, 15.6; Duke, 10; Georgia, 10; L. S. U., 9.1; Tulane, 7.6; Auburn, 5; N. C. State, 5; Virginia, 4.5; Georgia Tech, 3; Clemson, 3; V. P. L., 2.2, and South Carolina, 1.

Some 2,500 fans refused to let rain keep them away from the meet.

Six Records Fall

Six conference indoor records fell before the assault of the star track and field men. Fulmer, Duke, broke the broad jump record in the last event of the night to bring the new marks to half a dozen. Coleman, Auburn, set a new shot put mark but three others also bettered the previous record.

Tar Heel Record Setters

Carolina's four record setters were Ray Ruble, who first tied with Arnold, team-mate, for a new mark and then bettered the tied figure by more than three inches; Lionel Weil, whose new record is in the 440; Jensen, in the mile run, and the Tar Heel mile relay quartet of Jensen, Martin, Weil and Drane.

The Tar Heels went ahead in the first event completed—the high jump, which Bagby won in the afternoon. And they remained ahead throughout. After eight events had been run off Carolina had a lead over Alabama, then runner-up, of a fraction less than 20 points.

Win Fresh Meet, Too

North Carolina also won the freshman contest, scoring 25.17 points. Washington and Lee was second with nine points; Duke and Virginia had six each; Richmond had five and V. P. L. 2.83.

In the non-conference meet, which had only the 60-yard dash and the mile relay, Davidson College led with 10 points, and Presbyterian College was second with five.

Gate City High Wins

Greensboro High School won the scholastic honors, with 11.33 points. High Point was a close second with 11.17, and Wilmington next with 8.33.

Farmer Injured; Out

The star Tar Heel dash man, Charlie Farmer, injured a leg in the trial heat of the 60-yard dash and was unable to qualify. He set the conference indoor record last year.
